5. Reports

a. Principal

- There is currently a lot of staff illness and TOC shortage. This is district wide.
- Student illness: RSV is circulating at the school, especially in the younger classes. Please keep kids home when sick. Tanya has contacted the district health and safety officer to see if there is information that can be passed out to parents.
- An extra division was added in September resulting in a 0.20 prep time posting. Sarah Robinson has posted into this and will be at the school on Wednesdays doing prep for 2 classes as well as some support hours
- The TOC for the vacant grade 6/7 teacher position has posted into a position at another school. There is currently a new TOC in the classroom. The position has been posted externally
- Classroom teachers are prepping for student conferences. Parents can decide if they want these in person or virtually. Portfolios will be sent home for all students.
- Due to ongoing concerns with covid-19 and staff/student concerns with exposure in crowds, there will be no Christmas concern this year. There will be a primary choral event in the spring as well as an intermediate talent show
- Teachers also want to celebrate and acknowledge the multicultural aspect of the school and expose students to various holidays. Last week Diwali was celebrated.
- Tanya is writing a grant proposal to obtain 10 new iPad

- Needing 10 new iPad need to come from operation budget. This is an addition to the 10 that the school is writing a grant for
- Long Jump pit at the front of the school. The current one at the back of the school is not level and is sitting next to concrete and is also used as a sandbox.
- Body Science Kate coming in this year. PAC usually pays for half
- Coffee for teacher appreciation school conference day, Tanya suggested using Kanaka Coffee and requesting \$350 for this and have it occur Dec. 8th which is a student conference day
- PLAN: Charles & Shiva to review budget. Decisions will be tabled until next PAC meeting
