DPAC Report – Jodi Murphy

- Live YouTube stream for Grade 8 Registration January 28th, 2021
 O Any questions Grade8reg@gmail.com
- Grade 8 Registration was Thursday, February 4th, 2021 time stamp is activated when enter the account to register
 - \circ February 19th, is when the registration closes
 - Placement is based on your catchment school (portal will tell you what your catchment school is, as well as your French immersion catchment school)
 - o Second is if you have a sibling at the placement school
 - o Third is first and second choice
 - $_{\odot}$ If out of catchment school is requested, they will do a draw.
 - May 26th is proposed to do a Grade 7 day at high school visit.
 - This may be virtual or something else.
 - Last week of August is still planned for new Grade 8 students to come get their locker assignments and timetables if they do lockers next year.
- Goal is to do semester system next year for high school students. 4 classes for half the year and 4 classes for the other half. Currently doing quarter system, 2 classes for 10 weeks, but it's not ideal. It could be 1.5 years between having a math class depending on what part of the year the class falls in the students' schedule.
- High school placements will be announced on March 1st, 2021
- High school transfers start on March 5, 2021
- After Spring Break, the Grade 7 teachers will meet with the high school teachers for transition meetings
- If you need any information about Grade 8, go to the district website, under the "parents" tab, it'll tell you all about the registration and transfer process.
- If your child goes to cyber school, wheelhouse, etc. you have no exception to your catchment school
- Cannot register your student for Grade 8 if you are out of the country. Parent Portal does not work out of the country

- Stained Clothing / Rashes
 - Possible issues with Vital Oxide use in schools
 - DPAC received many reports of staining/damage to student's clothing and reports of rashes possibly associated to exposure to Vital Oxide and/or residue associated with its use.
 - DPAC continues to research and investigate this issue. There are documented reports across Canada and the USA, particularly the stained clothes; certain dyes and/or cotton often noted as being commonly affected.
 - There is no information that Vital Oxide itself is inherently unsafe, there may be a number of factors that are contributing to this issue which may be resolved with updated information/understanding on the use of this product and improved/enhanced cleaning procedures and protocols that may be unique to the school environment, including over cleaning.
 - All emails have been forwarded to the District. Their SD42 Health & Safety committee and Fraser Health will continue to research issues.
 - Possible staining due to wet clothing after being out in the rain is reactivates the Vital Oxide.

- SD42 DPAC resolution to BCCPAC
 - DPAC is in the process of writing an Ordinary Resolution for submission to BCCPAC to be voted on at their AGM on May 1st, 2021. This resolution will be asking BCCPAC to no longer support FSAs for Grade 4 and 7, and if that should fail to pass, to provide complete transparency when advocating for the parents of BC, and encouraging them to have their children participate in writing them, including the option to not have their children participate.
