Kindergarten registration is done on the Parent Portal. Registration opens at 12:00pm (noon) on the first day of each registration phase.

GRADE 8 REGISTRATION FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR

Grade 8 registration for the 2024-25 school year is done on the parent portal. Online registration begins on February 13, 2024 at 12:00pm (noon) and closes on February 27, 2024 at 11:59pm. The online registration form will automatically populate with your child's secondary catchment school. This is determined by your address. <u>Please take a moment to ensure your parent portal account has your current address</u>. Any change of student's address needs to be done at the office along with two supporting documents. This information will not update in the portal until the next day.

STUDENT CONFERENCES

The Maple Ridge - Pitt Meadows School District (SD42) will be offering families a choice for student inclusive conferences this year. This is a time when you, your child and the teacher meet. These formal term 1 and 2 conferences will be offered as either in person or virtual to allow families the choice that works best for them. At the time of booking, you will be offered the choice of conference type. Teachers will let you know when the specific times for virtual conferences will be.

Please watch for a message on when you will be able to book your conference in the SD42 Parent Portal.

During the conference, teachers will discuss your child's academic learning, strengths, and areas to develop, then set a collaborative learning goal for your child. You will also be able to ask any questions you may have.

Your child's classroom teacher looks forward to engaging with you and your child during this important reporting event.

SCHOOL CLOSURE DECISION: SNOW

If, for any reason, there are personal concerns about the ability to travel safely to school, other arrangements should be made.

ATTENDANCE REMINDER PARENT

If your child will be absent from school, arriving late, or being picked up early, please be sure to mark this either on the parent portal, by email at <u>are_reception@sd42.ca</u>, or by phone at 604-463-3035. If your child is marked absent and has not been excused by a parent this will come up on our call sheet. We will contact all numbers we have in attempt to confirm that your child is safe.

VISITORS OR DROPPING ITEMS OFF

For safety reasons, all visitors and volunteers are required to sign-in, sign-out and wear a visitor's tag while in the building or on the school grounds outside.

If you have a message or something to drop off for your child, you may do so through the office. Your child can also be called down to the office to see you if necessary. This also minimizes disruption to the class during instructional time and confusion if the class are out of the room on a scheduled prep block.
