#### **NEXT YEAR'S KINDERGARTEN**

Thank you to all the new kindergarten students who attended our "Ready, Set, Kindergarten" event. Please watch for an email coming home containing important information regarding gradual entry and times for small group sessions in September. We have purchased supplies in bulk for ALL kindergarten students. Payment will be requested in September.

#### SCHOOL SUPPLIES 2025-2026

**Primary students (Kindergarten-Gr 3)** will have their school supplies supplied by the school for a fee. The fee for kindergarten supplies will be \$55.00 and the fee for Grade 1-3 supplies will be \$60.00. Payment will be requested in September.

**Planners** — Many teachers request their students to us a student planner to assist in staying organized. Individual teachers will inform their students of this, and a planner will be provided for a fee. The fee will be \$8.00. Payment will be requested in September.

Intermediate students (Gr 4 -7) will need to purchase their own supplies. You have two options; you can purchase your supplies on your own or you can order online through School Start.

#### MAKE A WISH FOLLOW-UP

Mrs. Murphy has now received notice about not only our grand total donated to the Make-a-Wish Foundation this year, but also that Alexander Robinson has donated **\$22,288.20** since our first ever donation of \$2,808 in April 2010 Way to go, AR!!

With our \$1,383.00 raised this year, we are helping to grant wishes such as Christos' (please see below). On Wish Day (April 29th) this year, certain companies were tripling the donations that were submitted. As we were able to submit our donation on Wish Day, this \$1,383.00 turned into \$4,149.00!!!

A wish on average costs approximately \$10,000 to \$12,000. Half of this is typically provided through inkind donations, and the other half is paid for in cash.

Alexander Robinson has done a wonderful act of kindness by granting two full wishes since we began in 2009/2010. Thank-you so very much to everyone who was able to collect even a single dollar in their Make a Wish bank and/or buy a freezie at school this year--we hope to have your continued support as we aim to help grant another child's wish next year!

\*\*Please remember that the blue star-shaped banks are no longer available to us as the cost to make them has skyrocketed and the Make-a-Wish Foundation can no longer afford to provide the banks. Please keep your child's Make-a-Wish bank, whichever kind of container it is, in a safe place for next year as only new and Kindergarten students will receive one in the fall.

#### **Christos' Wish**

Christos was born with a gastrointestinal disorder and spent a lot of his childhood in surgeries, procedures and medical appointments. Life wasn't easy and the constant treatments took their toll. On his 13th birthday, Christos learned that he would have his wish to host an episode of his favourite game show come true! When he arrived on set, Christos and his family were treated like VIPs. Onstage, Christos was a natural—even cracking jokes with the contestants when it was his turn to ask questions. After the show, Christos took his bows to a cheering audience and shook hands around the control room. Christos' mom, Marianna, is forever grateful for the great boost of confidence Christos got from his wish...it reminds him and his family that there's life outside of all the appointments and procedures.

#### The Science of a Wish

A child living with critical illness faces life-altering, complex physical and health challenges. A wish can stir the **strength and optimism that are crucial** to fighting physical, emotional and psychological adversity. In fact, the majority of Wish Kids go on to beat their illnesses and live typical, healthy lives.

Medical professionals agree that the wish experience improves the child's overall quality of life and is a turning point in their treatment.

#### **SD42 Student Transportation Registration 2025/2026**

Registration for students eligible for school district transportation for the 2025/2026 school year will be open online until **June 27**, **2025**, **at 4:00 pm**.

Regular student transportation is available for eligible students living and attending school in the following school catchments:

- Blue Mountain Elementary
- Garibaldi Secondary (who are not residing in Silver Valley/ Rockridge area)

- Highland Park Elementary
- Pitt Meadows Secondary
- Webster's Corners Elementary
- Whonnock Elementary

Eligibility for regular student transportation is based on grade level and distance from the catchment area school as outlined below:

- Grades K-3 students living farther than 4 kms from their catchment school
- Grades 4-12 students living farther than 4.8 kms from their catchment school

Eligibility for transportation for students with special needs is based on criteria set out in <u>Policy</u> 5400 on the school district website.
