I am looking forward to seeing the excitement this afternoon as our children return to school! We hope all of you enjoyed time this summer creating lasting memories with your families and friends. If you are new to Alouette, we wish you a warm welcome! Ms. Ferris and I feel grateful to return to the school we love, and work with a dedicated team of educators who have been busy preparing for another amazing year. Alouette also has a hard-working and thoughtful PAC who give much of their time to support our school.

September is always eventful, and we really appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation as we adjust to the new school year. We understand that parents and students are eager to know their classroom teacher however, schools must have an accurate understanding of enrollment numbers before placing students in classrooms. Therefore, students will go to their last year's classrooms until we receive confirmation from the district that we may transition to new classes. We hope to move students to their new classes by Monday, September 12. For convenience and safety, we request that you please arrange an outdoor meeting spot for your child each day at dismissal.

A new school year often instills both excitement and anxiety in many of us. Talking to your children about their feelings helps them to understand these emotions are common. Reassuring your child and staying calm can help him/her to transition smoothly into their new class. Remember, your own perspective can also inform how your child will view school. Give your child time to settle into their new classroom, make new friends, and adjust to a new teacher. Asking them to share the positive parts of their day can help them to feel content about going to school.

We thank-you in advance for respecting the health & safety protocols that are in place at school. Hand washing and staying home when sick help everyone to stay well. All visitors are required to sign in at the office and wear a visitor badge. It is important that corridors remain clear so that teaching and learning are not disrupted. Students enter and dismiss through the outside classroom doors or alternative exits for the few classrooms that do not have an outside door. Please arrange a meeting place outside at dismissal. If you wish to discuss a matter with your teacher, a meeting can be arranged through his/her email. Several events take place later this month. Our Terry Fox Run will take place on September 23 where we honour a great Canadian Hero. Teachers will send out more information specific to your class. We will be holding a ceremony for the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on Thursday, September 29 in the morning, outside on the field. And please note that schools are closed on Friday, September 30 for the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation holiday. This day commemorates the history and harm of the residential school system, while the spirit of reconciliation offers hope for generations of children to come. Finally, there is no school on Monday, October 3rd as staff work on our school growth plan.

I am delighted to return to Alouette for the third year and welcome Ms. Ferris as our vice principal. A monthly newsletter is sent via the parent portal to share reminders and important information to our community. There is a lot of important school information in this newsletter, so we thank you for taking the time to read it carefully. We appreciate the promise and possibility that a new school year brings, and we look forward to working together to help make your child's experience a positive one.

Student Illness

Parents and caregivers must assess their child daily for symptoms of common cold, influenza, COVID-19, or other infectious respiratory disease before sending them to school. **If a child has any symptoms, they must not go to school.** If your child is not attending due to illness or any other reason, please contact the school number to report the absence. Attendance will be taken by staff each morning and we will follow up with parents on all absences which were not already reported to the school. If your child becomes ill while at school, we will contact you to come to the school right away.

Medical Intervention Forms

If your child has any health care needs that require support at school, including but not limited to administration of any medication or a life-threatening condition including anaphylaxis, diabetes and seizure disorders, new medical forms must be completed every year. The school cannot assist with any medical intervention unless these forms are completed. Please contact the school as soon as possible to complete a form. Please note, the medical forms for anaphylaxis and diabetes require a physician's signature. This procedure complies with the school district policy regarding the health care needs of children at school. If there are any questions, please contact the school.

We are a Nut Aware School

As it is the start of another school year, it is important to remind everyone we have several students with SEVERE LIFE-THREATENING allergies to a variety of nuts, including tree nuts and peanuts. If this applies to your child, please make certain that you have notified the office and the classroom teacher and that you have provided the appropriate medical information and necessary medication. Students with life-threatening allergies should wear a waist pouch containing an epi-pen and a second one should be stored in the office. This is school district policy.

We are a Scent Free School

There are members in our Alouette community who have scent sensitivities. Thank-you for reminding your children to avoid using scented products at school.

School Hours

We have a late start on the first day of school, Tuesday, September 6. Students attend 12:30 - 2:20. Starting Wednesday, September 7 regular school hours will be in effect: 8:30 - 2:20. Recess will be 10:20 - 10:35 and lunch 11:50 - 12:30.

Staffing Updates

Maple Ridge is growing and so is our enrollment. We have added another division at Alouette. We welcome Ms. MacPhail, Ms. Markowski and Ms. Reilly to our team!

Parking

Student safety is our top priority. Signs are posted that all parking lots are designated for staff and vehicles displaying the disabled tag in their windshield. <u>PLEASE DO NOT PULL INTO</u> <u>THE PARKING LOTS</u>. We recommend parking on a nearby adjacent street and walking your child to school. Ensure all pedestrians use designated crosswalks and approach with caution. We appreciate your cooperation in this regard as we work together to positively impact our children's school experience and keep everyone safe.

Drop off & Pick up Circle

Please do not park in this area to escort children to classes. This area is delegated for dropping off students and clearing the area quickly to avoid traffic building up on the street. It is necessary to park on a nearby street if your child must be escorted to class.

Parent Portal Permissions

<u>Please login to the parent portal and submit permissions for all items listed as soon as</u> <u>possible. Permissions must be completed annually for each child</u>. Walking off School Grounds consent is required prior to September 23 for students to participate in the Terry Fox Run where the students walk/run around the neighbourhood block. To publish your child's photo in the yearbook, the permission must be completed in the portal.

We also require all children to have updated **Emergency Release Forms**. We will rely on this information for releasing all students in the event of an emergency. This form is also completed in the parent portal.

Student Planners

These are used as a home/school communication book and allows children to develop organizational skills as they keep track of homework and track goals. The cost is \$7.00 and may be submitted on the portal or by cheque payable to Alouette Elementary submitted to the office or to your teacher along with the attachment at end of this newsletter. Please note that Kindergarten, Wheelhouse and Grade 6/7 classes do NOT use planners.

Student Photos

The photographer will be at our school September 27 to take individual student photos. Don't forget to bring your smiles! Photo retakes will take place on October 11.
