READING CORNER

Nightly reading time is critical for your child's long-term reading development so please make reading time a priority in the months ahead. Reading is an important factor in school success.



It is sometimes wrongly assumed that reading skills are due mainly to natural ability; that children are either good readers or they are not. This is simply not the case. While it is true that some children do initially learn to read more easily, the MOST important factor in a student's eventual reading level is the amount of time they spend reading. One study of almost forty thousand fifth graders found that those who read 40 minutes a day acquired almost four times the vocabulary of students who read only 12 minutes a day. It also found that students whose families encouraged reading activities at home had higher reading achievement. Reading research consistently shows a potent relationship

between the volume of reading and reading achievement, so please encourage your child to read every night!

Please ensure that your children are aware of lunchtime and afterschool arrangements when they arrive at school in the morning.
