PARENT LEARNING SURVEYS 2022/2023

The Provincial Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size, and usefulness to schools. The Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 and 7, all school staff as well as **our** parent community. We encourage parents to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included. MOVING AND STUDENT TRANSFER REQUESTS

Although spring has just begun, plans are in full swing for September. If you know that you will be moving and not attending Alouette Elementary for the 2023/2024 school year, please let us know so that we can more accurately plan. Registrations, withdrawals, and transfer requests for students who are currently in Grades Kindergarten – 6 must be completed on the parent portal. Please note that this transfer process does **not** apply to incoming Kindergarten students. Incoming Kindergarten students who are not placed in their first-choice school are waitlisted for this school. The goal is to share strategies and resources that make early learning through play a priority in the home and support children in a successful transition to school. WHEELHOUSE AT ALOUETTE

The Wheelhouse is a classroom where **grade 6 and 7 students** are both challenged and supported in becoming life-long learners and responsible citizens. Some of the highlights of the program include:

- Weekly Field Study Days where students learn outside the regular class setting.
- A classroom of care and discovery that is well supported by staff, parents, and community mentors.
- Leadership activities that improve confidence, citizenship, and social responsibility.
- Wheelhouse students are also part of the school district 1-to-1 program, where each student is assigned an iPad for use throughout the school year.

Eligibility

CYBERSCHOOL PROGRAM 2023/2024 FOR GRADE 6/7 ALOUETTE STUDENTS

Cyberschool offers the traditional school curriculum using technology as a 21st century tool to enhance and extend student learning. Flexibility and choice, collaborative learning, time management, inquiry, and knowledge building are elements of this program. On the cyberday students will interact with other students and their teacher, utilize the resources of the internet, and discuss issues online while still being able to retain the personal contact that traditional face-to-face learning allows. Students in this program will attend school four days a week (Mon, Tues, Wed, Fri) and work from home on Thursdays.

READING CORNER

Reading cartoons is still worthwhile reading! Research has shown that boys often prefer more visual and nonfiction reading that contain facts and information while girls prefer more fictional stories. If your son does not seem as interested in reading, try different types of literature. Bring home some nonfiction books on amazing facts and strange creatures or more visual reading such as comic books (i.e., Garfield or Calvin and Hobbs). Research has shown that comic books really help students to predict and infer. Both are key reading skills that good readers use. Remember, any reading is good reading because it all helps to reinforce the patterns within the English language.

DRESS CODE

The school district is committed to providing students with learning environments that are safe, responsive, and inclusive. The district recognizes that decisions about dress reflect individual expression of identity, socio-cultural norms, and that they are personal. Students may attend school and school-related functions in dress of their choice provided that their choices:
