#### **INTERNET SAFETY PRESENTATIONS**

Alouette has invited Safer Schools Together (SST) to present workshops to our parents and intermediate students on this important topic. SST is the subject matter expert for the Province of British Columbia, and other jurisdictions throughout North America. They have been recognized by all levels of government for the development of effective and innovative strategies that ensure safe and caring school communities. We are holding a 2-hour session for parents and caregivers by Zoom on Tuesday evening, May 9 from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. There will also be sessions during the day on May 12 for students in Grades 4 - 7. #### TO REGISTER FOR THIS PARENT/CAREGIVER SESSION, PLEASE CLICK HERE

This session is for parents/caregivers of students in Grades 4 - 7. Your child in the intermediate grades has now entered the phase of their digital media lives where cell phone ownership doubles, video game use explodes, and social media use becomes problematic. At this age, children encounter situations that will challenge their independence. A snapshot of current trends and concerning applications will be provided to equip you in your digital parenting strategy. This session will cover recommendations for family rules, parental controls, family tech plans, as well as suggestions for monitoring your tween/teen's digital life. #### ALL PHOTO PERMISSIONS REQUIRED FOR YEARBOOK

It is very important to verify that all your permissions are up to date on the portal. We can only insert class photos into our yearbook if we receive permission from every child in the class. If your child does not have a portal permission, then we cannot publish their photo in our annual yearbook. Please avoid disappointment and submit your Elementary Yearbook Permission at your earliest convenience through the parent portal. Our office staff can assist you if you have any questions.

#### **STUDENT INFORMATION**

Please remember to let the school office know if any of your child's information changes, i.e., home phone number, cell phone number, work phone number, address, emergency contact information, email address, etc. <u>It is very important that the school has updated information</u> <u>on your children in case of emergency.</u> Thank you.

#### PARKING

Student safety is our top priority. Signs are posted that all parking lots are designated for staff and vehicles displaying the disabled tag in their windshield. <u>PLEASE DO NOT PULL INTO</u> <u>THE PARKING LOTS</u>. We recommend parking on a nearby adjacent street and walking your child to school. Ensure all pedestrians use designated crosswalks and approach with caution. The roundabout in front is only for drop off and pick up. Please do not park in the drop off zone and escort your child to class. Also, please remain in your vehicle at pick up if you are waiting for your child in the roundabout. We appreciate your cooperation in this regard as we work together to positively impact our children's school experience and keep everyone safe.

#### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

#### Dress for the Weather

Please remind children to apply their sunscreen, wear a hat and bring a water bottle to school. It's important to ensure they are dressed suitably for the outdoors. Our students are outside for recess and 20 minutes at lunch. We also hold some classes outdoors. There are very few covered areas to get away from the sunshine and we want them to be protected from the strong UV rays at this time of year.

#### Wheels at School

Please ensure children wear a helmet if they are riding a bike/scooter to school. Their heads are precious, and we care that they are safe. We do ask children to walk their wheels when on school grounds to avoid any accidents due to congestion at arrival and dismissal. Thanks for your support!

#### School Access

For the safety of our students, all visitors and volunteers are required to sign-in and sign-out at the office and wear a "visitor" tag while in the school. To ensure an uninterrupted learning environment in classrooms, parents or visitors with lunches or messages are reminded to leave them at the office and they will be forwarded at a convenient time. Parents/visitors are to refrain from going directly to classrooms.

#### Lockdown Drill at Alouette

We will be holding a lockdown drill on May 25 at Alouette. Students will be advised that this is a practice much like our fire drills. Lockdowns may be necessary where there is an internal or external threat to the safety of the school occupants. A "lockdown" is a situation where an announcement is made and staff and students are to remain in a secure location with doors locked and windows closed, and cell phones turned off. As with fire drills and other safety programs, the hope is to familiarize students and staff with a procedure that they will be able to follow quickly, effectively, and safely.

### **MOVING AND STUDENT TRANSFER REQUESTS**

Although spring has just begun, plans are in full swing for September. If you know that you will be moving and not attending Alouette Elementary for the 2023/2024 school year, please let us know so that we can more accurately plan. Registrations, withdrawals, and transfer requests for students who are currently in Grades Kindergarten -6 must be completed on the parent portal.

Please note that this transfer process does **not** apply to incoming Kindergarten students. Incoming Kindergarten students who are not placed in their first-choice school are waitlisted for this school. If families move or need to request a new placement for their incoming kindergarten child, they email <u>reghelp@sd42.ca</u>.

#### NEXT YEAR'S CLASS PLACEMENT

We are beginning to create our classes for next year. Please be assured that staff devote considerable time, care, and attention to this process. This very complex and lengthy responsibility occurs over several weeks and continues into September when class placements are finalized.

Throughout the year, there have been many opportunities for parents and teachers to discuss each child. Staff work together to consider the following criteria very carefully: **social emotional skills and relationships,** as well as **learning styles, strengths, and needs.** Our goal is to create safe and engaging inclusive classrooms that balance these factors, as equitably as possible.

If you feel there is further information to consider about your child, you may submit input to the principal and your child's current teacher, in writing by May 31, 2023. <u>*Please refrain from requesting specific teachers or peers by name.*</u>
