The school cannot assist with any medical intervention unless these forms are completed. Please contact the school as soon as possible to complete a form. This procedure complies with the policy regarding the health care needs of children at school. If there are any questions, please contact the school. Thanks.

NOTE: If you are new to the school or your child has a recently diagnosed medical condition, please inform your child's teacher and we will send forms home.

Dressing for Fall: With upcoming/possible cooler temperatures and rainy weather, we ask that you ensure your child/children are dressed appropriately for the weather. We strive to have 'West Coast' Recess/lunches (students outside on rainy days); therefore sending your child with boots, rain-gear, hats, gloves, is necessary and appreciated. Please ensure your child has a pair of dry indoor shoes and an extra change of clothes –just in case your child falls down and gets wet. By sending an extra change of clothes, this alleviates office pile up at the phone to call home and wasted learning time. Thanks for your assistance.

INDOOR SHOES are mandatory. ALL students need to have a clean pair of shoes left at school so they can change into daily. These shoes should be either lace up or Velcro shoes as they will be wearing them to gym and playing active games. To keep our school clean and for your child's safety, indoor shoes are a must. Thanks.

STUDENT SAFETY: Children riding bikes or scooters should wear a helmet at all times and are not permitted to ride on school grounds. Let's keep everyone safe!

STUDENT INFORMATION SHEETS

Student Information Sheet for <u>each</u> child will be sent home next week. It is ABSOLUTELY IMPERATIVE we have all information filled out and returned to your child's teacher ASAP. More Important School News

HEAD LICE: Reminder, please check your child's/children's hair for head lice as it is head lice season. If you notice any of the following, please contact the office. This will be kept confidential and a standard letter will be sent out to the relevant classes informing parents of the presence of lice. Evidence of Head Lice may be as follows:

- nits found on the hair
- live or dead lice seen on the scalp
- nit shells from hatched lice or dead eggs found in the hair

Parent Portal Reminder

DON'T MISS OUT on another announcement, event, newsletter or field trip! In the fall, all forms and announcements will continue to be communicated from the school through the SD42 Forms and Parents Portal. If you are not on the portal please take a few minutes of your time to create an account at https://parents.sd42.ca/.

Parent make sure you have completed the policy/permission forms awaiting your approval on the portal!

District forms have been sent out through the portal. These forms are necessary to complete so your child can go on walking field trips, use iPads, etc. Please complete them ASAP. Remember to scroll down in each box as this indicates to the district that you have read the forms. If you have any issues, please come and see Mrs. Scoular.

Phone Use:

Just a reminder that children are not allowed to use the phone unless it is an urgent situation. Coordinating home visits, etc, is something that students are expected to do the previous evening. The office phone must remain free for business or emergency calls.

Students arriving after 8:30 a.m. are late. Please continue to be supportive of our



continue to be supportive of our punctuality goals by helping your children arrive on time for classes. Valuable instructional time for the child is often lost as the first few minutes of class are usually when initial instruction/teaching for the lesson occurs. If your child arrives after 8:45, please have them check in at the office before proceeding to their classroom.

After School Programs at Blue Mountain: Please watch for an orange brochure in your child's backpack informing you of the Fall selection of After School Programs. Programs are offered three times per year, Fall, Winter and Spring running for either 4-6 weeks, our first set will start the beginning of October. Registration information can be found in the brochure, if your child requires extra support in the classroom please contact Drea Owen prior to registration to ensure the program will be a good fit. Children benefit from participating in after school programs both academically and socially, creating opportunities to build on traditional learning outcomes but also through new friendships and experiences. BME Breakfast Program has started this week!

For any new families... our BME breakfast program is supported by the Food Bank as well as donations. We offer a sit down meal for any students who would like it. Food offerings change daily... but generally include a choice from cold cereal, toast, yogurt tubes, granola bars, cheese strings, and juice. Some mornings we have fresh pancakes, frozen waffles or eggs.

Students <u>must</u> enter via the outside set of doors by the gym, rather than coming in through front doors and down the hall. Doors open at 8am and food service is 8am-8:20am. After they have eaten, students exit the school to go and line up outside with their class.

If you are interested in cooking for the Breakfast Program, we do have Monday available. Also our coornitor, Merilee Gordon, will continue this year but this will be her last as her child is in gr 7. (BME fax number is 604-463-4955). Or you can apply at the Government Agent located at 175 22470 Dewdney Truck Rd. Maple Ridge, BC V2X 5X6. Abstracts are required to be updated every two years.

VOLUNTEERS & VISITORS

DISTRICT NEWS

Hospital Homebound Support

Do you have a son or daughter who is ill or
injured and unable to attend school?

School District No. 42 provides support to students who are unable to attend school for medical reasons. The Hospital Homebound teacher works with elementary and secondary students who have not been allocated support teacher time through a special needs designation. Students may be absent due to a non-contagious illness or they may be recovering from surgery or an injury. Instruction is provided in Ridge-Meadows Hospital or in the student's home.

How does Hospital Homebound support work?

The Hospital Homebound teacher provides instruction and support to students, with the goal of helping them return to class with as little interruption to The teacher also helps their education as possible. students maintain connections with the people and programs at their school. While receiving Hospital Homebound support, students continue to be registered at their school and in their classes. Students work on the core academic subjects. They often use the same materials and complete many of the same assignments as their classmates, although some adaptations may be necessary depending on the child's illness. Students typically receive two to three hours of support each week.

When can a student be referred?

Homebound students qualify for support if they are absent from school for 10 consecutive school days. Students who are hospitalized can be referred upon admittance to Ridge-Meadows Hospital.

How do I refer my son or daughter?

Contact your child's teacher, counselor, or administrator. He/she will complete the Student Support Services referral form. Appeal Process – SD42 Problem Solving/Appeal Process

In School District No. 42, we believe in working together to support our children. With input from parents, students, staff and community members, the district has developed guidelines intended to help prevent and/or resolve conflict.

Under Section 11 of the School Act, parents and students have the right to appeal decisions made by Board employees that "significantly affect the education, health or safety of a student." An

amendment to the School Act introduced in the spring of 2007 allows parents or students to appeal a decision of a Board of Education made under Section 11 to a Provincial Superintendent of Achievement. The Board has approved a new policy that is accompanied by a procedural bylaw that provides guiding principles for all steps of the appeal process.

WHO IS AN ABORIGINAL STUDENT?

Aboriginal Ancestry is determined on a voluntary basis through self-identification. This includes First Nations (status or non-status), Métis or Inuit Ancestry. No documentation is required and the ancestry can go back several generations. Ministry of Education funding is provided to support the success of all Aboriginal students through culturally appropriate educational programs and services. We encourage all students of First Nations, Metis, or Inuit Ancestry to complete a self-identification form as this allows you to access various supports and programs during the school year if you wish.
