Our students have been having some terrific experiences from building bird feeders and picking apples and turning them into sauce as they are developing their math and literacy abilities, to some learning the rules of the road on their bicycles. Too often we associate learning with a traditional image of sitting in rows, pen/pencil in hand, listening quietly to the teacher lecture. Research has clearly shown that learning is a dynamic process that occurs through all sorts of modalities and what works for one may not work for another. Therefore, you will see many teachers using a variety of strategies and activities to develop the skills and processes we are responsible to develop in our students. Where the confusion lies for so many of us parents is that we all went through school and we know what it "should" look like ...... Like it did when we went to school... But the reality is "no" it shouldn't.... We have advanced our understanding of development and learning through research and today's classrooms and expectations are far removed from the traditional "basics" of yester year.

For more information on the evolution of education and our understanding of development please come into the school and visit our little adult library, and sitting area, under the stairs. Many of the titles there speak to these very things and apply them to parenting and learning. If you see a title you'd like to borrow please feel free just let us know in the office of which title you're taking....
