Book FEST

Since the beginning of September, the grade 4,5,6 and 7 students have had the opportunity to be involved in the "Book Fest" program. Book Fest is where all the district teacher librarians have chosen a specific selection of books to read. There are eight books this year from a variety of authors. Also, on November 27th, the Fairview Book Fest team will have the opportunity to challenge other school teams about the books that have been read. In order to go to Book Fest at the ACT, students are required to read at least the number of books matching their grade (eg. grade 5 = 5 books), but reading more would be great.

Volunteering or Visiting?

We are so fortunate to have such an active group of volunteers in our community to offer support in our schools. Whether it is to help with reading to our children, handing out hot lunches, supporting our teachers with crafts and lessons, there are so many wonderful people coming in to help make our school a better place. We do ask that anyone visiting or volunteering in the building please come into the office to sign in and pick up a visitors tag to help identify you as a safe person for students and staff in the building. This not only helps students to identify you a safe adult, it helps to ensure we can account for you in the event of a fire drill or emergency situation.



What role does social awareness and responsibility play in the education of children?

When teachers provide opportunities within our classrooms and community to develop social awareness and responsibility, students gain the skills they need to become compassionate citizens. Building relationships, contributing to society, caring for the environment, resolving problems, and valuing diversity are facets of social emotional learning that exemplify a thriving child. Embedded within the social awareness and responsibility competency is the First Peoples' belief that we have commonalities with all people in our community, and a strong connection and responsibility to the land. When students advocate for themselves, others, and the environment, they develop a strong sense of self.

They are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning. Competencies are evident in every area of learning and in every grade, and come into play when students become actively engaged in their learning. During the school year, students will have an opportunity to self-assess their proficiencies in these core competencies.
