"Phase One" of the transfer process begins in February, and this is when it is best to submit your request. Transfer forms are available in any school office. As more details of the transfer timelines become available, we will send them out to you.

A reminder that as the weather starts to turn colder that schools are always open unless noted otherwise on the district website. While the radio stations announce school closures as they hear of them, www.sd42.ca will be the first place to find this information. If the schools are going to close, the website will be updated at 6:15am. We will try to make sure that this is also announced on our twitter feed @FVFalcons42

SCHOOL CLOSURE DECISION: SNOW

The decision to close schools due to accumulating snowfall is ultimately the responsibility of the superintendent, who must balance the safety of students, staff and parents with the need to provide learning. The decision is not taken lightly and is the result of a carefully thought out process that is reviewed after each experience and refined if necessary.

The decision to close schools is made by 6:15 a.m. Details are:

If, for any reason, there are personal concerns about the ability to travel safely to school, other arrangements should be made.

StrongStart is a free program for parents with children aged infant to five years old.

Parents and caregivers attending StrongStart BC will participate with their children in organized sessions like story time and circle time.

<u>Grade 8 Registration - September 2020</u>

- Registration for grade 8 for the 2020-2021 school year will be done on the parent portal.
- Online registration starts on February 4, 2020.
- DPAC will be holding a general information session regarding grade 8 registration at Thomas Haney January 16th from 7-9pm.
- There is no "LATE" phase for grade 8 this year. Parents who miss the March 1 online deadline must complete a paper registration form at their catchment school.
- Parents will be notified after Spring Break of their child's high school placement. Parents
 wishing to transfer schools must complete a transfer request form at the assigned school.
 A review of these transfer requests will be completed before the grade 7 orientation in
 May.

The online registration form will automatically populate with your child's secondary catchment school. This is determined by your address (not your elementary school). You can check the School District website

http://www.sd42.ca for your catchment school. Please note that new development areas may not reflect accurate results of your catchment school. Please call and confirm with the school if necessary. Families will be able to request their first three choices of schools. Registration numbers are limited by capacity. Details regarding acceptance criteria can be found on the SD42 website.

What is Eye See ... Eye Learn®?

Info Sheet for Parents/Guardians

Eye See ... Eye Learn* (ESEL) is a children's vision program created by the BC Doctors of Optometry (BCDO). The mission of ESEL is to detect, diagnose, and treat kindergarten children with vision problems so that every child in kindergarten can see and learn to the best of their ability.





ESEL provides kindergarten students from a participating school district with a comprehensive eye exam from a participating B.C. doctor of optometry at no cost to the family. If needed, kindergarten students will receive one pair of eyeglasses free of charge.

Why Participate in ESEL?

Good Vision = Better Learning

Each year, many children start school without ever having an eye exam, even though 80% of a child's learning is based on vision¹. Children who are unable to see the board, focus on a picture, or follow words in a book may struggle to achieve their full learning potential.

For children, several different visual skills must work together so they can see and understand clearly. If any of these visual skills are lacking or impaired, a child may need to work harder and develop headaches or fatigue. A child may not realize they have a vision problem, they may simply assume everyone sees the way they do.

The Need for Comprehensive Eye Exams

While vision screening is available for kindergarten children in B.C., they are not a substitute for a comprehensive eye exam. Vision screening only involves a limited number of simple tests that

cannot detect all eye problems. Undetected vision problems can lead to: frustration with learning, learning at a slower rate than other children, behavioural or discipline problems, or negative self-image.

Facts about Children's Vision

Did you know that ...?

- Almost 25% of school-age children have vision problems²?
- Children rarely complain of vision problems since they don't realize that they see the world differently from others?
- Vision problems are often mistaken as other developmental problems like dyslexia or ADHD?
- Vision screenings are only able to detect a small percentage of those children needing professional vision care?

READY, SET, LEARN (RSL) is a FREE early learning program that welcomes children ages 3 and 4 to the Maple Ridge - Pitt Meadows School District and helps them get ready for success in school. The program offers play activities, story-time and crafts. Families also receive a package that includes a children's book and parent tips for supporting a child's learning and development.
