Please note, the KINDERGARTEN students of Division 22, 23, and 24 will be dismissed at 11:15 a.m. on May 31, 2019. If you have a student in one of these classes, please remember to note this on your calendar!

STUDENT PLACEMENT 2019/2020

We are beginning to create our

classes for next year. Please be assured that staff devote considerable time, care and attention to this process. This very complex and lengthy responsibility occurs over several weeks and continues into September when class placements are finalized.

Throughout the year, there have been many opportunities for parents and teachers to discuss each child. Staff work together to consider the following criteria very carefully: social emotional skills and relationships, as well as learning styles, strengths and needs. Our goal is to create safe and engaging inclusive classrooms that balance these factors, as equitably as possible.

If you feel there is further information to consider about your child, you may submit input to the principal in writing by <u>May 10, 2019</u>. Please refrain from requesting specific teachers or peers by name.

Creative Children School Supplies

Order forms have now been sent home, and are due back no later than <u>Friday</u>, <u>May 24</u>, <u>2019</u> to allow for processing of all orders. The school supply kits



will be delivered to the school and given to your child at the start of school in September. <u>If you choose to purchase your own school supplies</u>, the Golden Ears'

<u>supply lists will be sent home with report cards</u> in June and posted to the school website.

Planning for September 2019

We would greatly appreciate your assistance in making an accurate calculation of student enrolment for September. To help achieve this goal, we are asking all parents whose children will definitely **NOT** be attending Golden Ears Elementary in September to contact the school office. A student transfer form will be required.

This request does not apply to Grade 7 students moving on to their selected high school. If you are aware of any families who have moved (or will be moving) into the area, please encourage them to contact the school to register their child(ren) prior to the end of June.

<u>Phase Two - Requests for Student</u> Transfers for Gr. 1 - 7

School District No. 42 allows parents and students to attend a school other than their "catchment" or "neighbourhood" school, provided there is space available at the school of choice. Parents who wish to have their children in grades 1 to 7 transfer to another school for September must do the following.

• OBTAIN STUDENT TRANSFER REQUEST FORM FROM THE OFFICE.

Parents will be notified prior to any transfer being completed.

This request does not apply to Grade 7 students moving on to their selected high school.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school and work are among the most important lessons we teach students. During their school years, students learn to take personal responsibility for their education. Please help us to teach your child healthy attitudes towards school and the work place by:

- Emailing <u>ge_reception@sd42.ca</u> or calling (604) 463-9513 each day your child is going to be absent or late;
- Minimizing the number of reasons for absence;
- 3. Contacting the teacher if you are concerned about attendance;
- Stressing promptness. Being on time shows respect for the activity and consideration for others.



Reading Corner - Things to Help Encourage Reading

For young children the famous author Mem Fox gives the following five suggestions:

- 1. Spend at least ten wildly happy minutes every single day reading aloud.
- Read at least three stories a day: it may be the same story three times. Children need to hear a thousand stories before they learn to read!
- Read aloud with animation. Listen to your own voice and don't be dull, or flat, or boring. Hang loose and be loud, have fun and laugh a lot.
- Read with joy and enjoyment: real enjoyment for yourself and great joy for the listeners.
- 5. Read the stories that the kids love over and over again, and always read in the same 'tune' for each book: i.e. with the same intonations on each page, each time.



<u>Vehicle and Student</u> Safety Reminder!

Please remember to drive slowly and exercise extreme caution when

driving near the school. The streets and our parking lot become very congested during drop off and pick up times. We want to keep all of our students as safe as possible. Also, please do not park across our neighbours' driveways. Thank you.


The Redesigned Curriculum at Golden Ears Elementary
