REQUESTS FOR STUDENT TRANSFERS FOR GRADES 1 - 7

School District No. 42 allows parents and students to attend a school other

than their "catchment" or "neighbourhood" school, provided there is space available at the school of choice. Parents who wish to have their children in grades 1 to 7 transfer to another school for <u>September</u> must do the following:

Obtain a STUDENT TRANSFER REQUEST FORM from their current school, complete the transfer form including signature and have the current principal sign and date it. Current school retains the Student Transfer Request Form. The principal takes the transfer forms to the elementary principals' meeting to see if there is room for your child's transfer. Info is on the school district website under the Parent Tab.

The Redesigned Curriculum at Golden Ears Elementary

What is the importance of Personal Awareness and Responsibility to the development of healthy, resilient children and youth?

Students who develop personal awareness and responsibility make healthy connections between individual and social behaviour. Within our new curriculum, students are taught how to self-advocate so that they can express what supports they need to be successful in school. The ability to self-advocate develops confidence and self-worth so that children and youth have the courage to convey how they feel in constructive ways, ask questions, admit mistakes and commit to learning in all facets of life. An essential First Peoples' Principle of Learning states that learning takes patience and time. Helping students understand this principle leads to perseverance in challenging times and encourages resiliency. Teaching our students to be personally aware and responsible leads to the development of healthy, whole children and youth.

Core Competencies: What are they and why are they in the new curriculum?

The new curriculum centres around the following three core competency areas: communication, personal and social, thinking. They are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning. Competencies are evident in every area of learning and in every grade, and come into play when students become actively engaged in their learning. During the school year, students will have an opportunity to self-assess their proficiencies in these core competencies.

STUDENT TRANSFER GUIDELINES: ELEMENTARY 2020/21

TRANSFER PHASE 1

Transfer Phase 1 takes place between February 11, 2020 and April 14, 2020.

To participate in Transfer Phase 1 for your current kindergarten to Grade 6 child for September 2020, obtain a **Student Transfer Request Form** from your child's current SD42 school and submit the completed and signed form to your child's current principal. If your child is new to the school district, use the school locator to find your child's catchment school (http://www.sd42.ca/school-locator/), then complete a registration form at that school.

Parents of students who reside out of district should contact the district office at 604.463.4200 for assistance.

The best chance to transfer schools is during Transfer Phase 1.

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA FOR PLACEMENT:

- 1. In-catchment with siblings already attending catchment school (proof of residence required) or displaced catchment siblings on district list;
- In-catchment (proof of residence required);
- 3. Out-of-catchment with siblings;
- 4. In-catchment daycare;
- 5. Out-of-catchment without siblings;
- 6. Out-of-district with siblings (register at the District Education Office);
- 7. Out-of-district without siblings.
- Successful transfer Phase 1 applicants will be contacted by April 22, 2020

TRANSFER PHASE 2

Transfer Phase 2 takes place between **April 20, 2020** and **June 9, 2020**. The process for Transfer Phase 2 is the same as for Transfer Phase 1 (see Transfer Phase 1). *The chance of a successful transfer in Transfer Phase 2 is less likely than in Transfer Phase 1*.

Successful transfer Phase 2 applicants will be contacted by June 17, 2020

TRANSFER PHASE 3

Transfer Phase 3 takes place between **June 15, 2020** and **August 22, 2020**. The process for Transfer Phase 3 is the same as for Transfer Phase 1 (see Transfer Phase 1). *The chance of a successful transfer in Transfer Phase 3 is less likely than in phases 1 and 2*.

Successful transfer Phase 3 applicants will be contacted by August 28, 2020

GOAL: The purpose of this event is to raise awareness of Canadian books and celebrate the richness, diversity and breadth of Canadian literature.


