Pink Shirt Day

Wednesday, February 23rd is Pink Shirt Day, where people across Canada wear pink to show that positive actions make a difference and that the change starts with each one of us. Pink Shirt Day is more than just a symbol of a shared belief in celebrating diversity - it's also a commitment to being open minded, accepting differences and learning to respect each other.

The idea of Pink Shirt Day started with two Nova Scotia high school students in 2007. When a fellow student was being bullied for wearing a pink shirt, they decided to take a stand. They went out and bought pink shirts to give to fellow students to show their support for a boy who was being bullied simply for wearing a pink shirt.

It is important to speak with our children about bullying. Bullying is defined as, "willful, repeated aggressive behaviour with negative intent used by a person to maintain power over another person." Specifically there is:

- Unequal power One person has more power than another person (or it seems this way to the people involved)
- *Hurtful actions* Physically or psychologically harmful behaviour takes place (such as name-calling, insults, threats, kicking, hitting, punching, etc.)
- Direct or indirect actions The behaviour may be face-to-face or done behind a person's back (such as teasing, exclusion, gossiping spreading rumours). It may also occur online through social media
- *Repetitive behaviour* The hurtful actions keep happening, so the person being affected finds it increasingly difficult to escape

Whether bullying occurs in-person or online, it is important that we support all students involved. If you are concerned that your child is the focus of bullying behaviour or that they may be exhibiting bullying behaviour, please reach out to your child's teacher or myself so we can work together to address these concerns.
