IB DP 5 Year Review

Over the course of 2021 - 2022 Garibaldi Secondary has been completing a significant review of the IB - Diploma Program. While this review is a "self reflective" process we have recognized the strength in our program.

We have developed an action plan that will allow us to continue our positive growth as a professional community, and as a school staff that supports a wide range of students.

First Peoples Principles of Learning

There are 9 First People Principles of Learning. Each is unique and reflective of positive values we look to bring to our school community:

Learning involves generational roles and responsibilities

This principle reflects the understanding that teaching and learning is the responsibility of all members of a community. The responsibility for teaching *belongs to everyone* in the community. As people develop their skills and knowledge in particular areas, it is expected that they will in turn teach others. This is seen as a responsibility that ultimately strengthens communities. Conversely, the responsibility for learning also lies with the learner. It is the responsibility of the learner to determine what he or she is supposed to learn from any given situation. For example, a learner may be told a story that is intended to help the learner learn something rather than being explicitly told what the lesson is. The learner must figure that out for him or herself. This process allows learners to develop understandings that are applicable to them personally, and that they see as relevant for a specific time and place. It also promotes personal responsibility for learning.



MYP Grade 8 - 10 Pathway to Approval

Garibaldi has been working with an IB MYP consultant (Lisa Nicholson) for 3 years to prepare for our application for authorization. Lisa is a highly experienced senior IB consultant and is on the writing team for many MYP primary source documents, we were privileged to have such a strong consultant with a vast knowledge of all things MYP to work with during this process.

Lisa provided detailed feedback on many aspects of the GSS program. Lisa was impressed with the teaching practices and learning experiences outlined in these unit plans and commented on the work, passion and dedication that GSS teachers exhibit.

Our consultation time with Lisa culminated with a two day virtual visit on April 22nd and 23rd. During these two days, Lisa met with every department and our administration team. She completed a review of the evidence we compiled in demonstrating our efforts in meeting all the Standards and Practices (70) for MYP.

In summary, Lisa approved our readiness for submitting our application for authorization (Fall 2021) which will be followed by a site visit for authorization (Spring 2022). After meeting with all departments over the course of the two days, Lisa's final report showed that she was **very impressed with our teaching staff, specifically our reflective skills, our growth mindset and our thoughtful and insightful questions.**

Thanks need to be shared with our staff and district leadership that has supported release time to complete the remaining unit plans and interdisciplinary units for the Spring Authorization visit.
