PARKING

Please be respectful of Hammond's neighbouring properties and not block driveways when dropping off or picking up your children. Please <u>do not park for any length of time</u> in our designated handicap parking spaces. Those spaces are for vehicles with handicap passes ONLY. If you park there thinking you will only be a moment, that moment could be the time one of our handicap students needs that spot. Your respect and consideration is appreciated.

A reminder to those families using the parking lot at the end of the day, if everyone follows our procedures and is patient for 10 minutes things will go smoothly and safely. It is with cooperation, patience and following a few simple guidelines that we can minimize the frustrations and keep the parking lot safe for everyone.

Guidelines:

- When double parked or stopping beside a yellow curb you <u>must</u> stay in your vehicle so you can
 move it if the person you are blocking needs to exit the lot.
- Do not block an open parking space.
- It is imperative that we leave a **clear path** through the middle of the lot so traffic can keep moving.
- If you get to the <u>flagpole</u> and your child has not arrived yet, continue to circle the lot until they do.
- Do not park at the entrance that funnels traffic into and out of the lot as it blocks traffic flow.
- Use the perimeter sidewalks to walk to the overflow lot rather than weaving in and out of the cars.
- If you have a large vehicle, or are towing any trailers, please consider parking on side streets.
- Please be respectful of our cones and try not to break them.
- Travel through the parking lot at idle speed.

SCHOOL DISTRICT NEWS...

Registration for kindergarten begins January 4, 2023. Registering your child for kindergarten is a big step, but it doesn't have to be a difficult one. With the easy new online registration process, you can register your child from the comfort of your own home. Re3view the registration steps below to ensure you are ready for the big day. Complete steps 1-4 before registration to save time.

- STEP 1: OPEN A PARENT PORTAL ACCOUNT You must open an SD42 Parent Portal account to access registration. If possible, complete this step well before registration.
- STEP 2: FIND YOUR REGISTRATION DATE Review the registration categories (SIBLING, CHOICE, GENERAL) to find your registration period. Dates are posted on the school district website. Registration for the 2023/24 school year will open January 4, 2023.
- STEP 3: REVIEW THE REGISTRATION FORM Review a copy of the online registration form before registration day. (Available starting January 2023 at http://parents.sd42.ca)
- STEP 4: REVIEW ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA The order in which the district places new kindergarteners is determined by the Acceptance Criteria. Review these online.
- STEP 5: REGISTER your child at http://parents.sd42.ca
- STEP 6: PROVIDE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION - Registrations begin January 4, 2023

Kindergarten registration for the 2023/24 school year is open to children who are 5 years old on or before December 31, 2023. Visit the district website for detailed information on the five phases (sibling registration, choice registration, general registration, and late registration), registration timelines, and other important information: http://www.sd42.ca/kindergarten-registration/

Kindergarten Registration Phases:

JAN 4-10: Sibling Registration. Open for siblings of students already attending the desired elementary school (currently in grades K-6).

JAN 11: Enviro Registration. Open for all students who want to participate in SD42's Environmental School.

JAN 18-23: *Choice Registration*. Open for all students who want to participate in any one of SD42's unique program offerings (e.g. French Immersion, Montessori).

FEB 1-7: General Registration. General registration for English school.

FEB 22-July 28: Late Registration. This phase is for parents who may have missed previous registration phases.

online registration always opens at 12:00 pm on each of the first registration days
