Used Book Sale



School Supplies

For the upcoming 2019-2020 school year we will be collecting money for your child's school supplies. We are requesting \$40 per Grade 1-7 and \$50 per Kindergarten student to pay for notebooks, pencils, scissors, glue and any other materials necessary for school work. Collecting funds will allow your child's teacher to ensure the quality of the supplies - no need to buy pencils that won't sharpen properly or pens that won't write. Communal supplies will allow the teacher to purchase extra supplies as needed, so you won't ever have to worry about buying your child new felts half way through the year. These supplies will be less expensive as we will be buying in bulk and your child's teacher will make sure that your child has everything that he or she will need for the whole year. It will also allow the teacher to purchase special supplies for exploring aspects of the new BC curriculum and new projects to support student learning. Best of all, this saves you both time and money.

We hope that by collecting funds we will save you some summertime hassle. There will be a Portal notice at the end of June so parents can pay on the Parent Portal via credit card or by cash/cheque made out to Harry Hooge.

Many classroom teachers also choose to use planners. These will continue to be purchased separately and will be available in the fall for \$10.
