Physical Education Awards from Mr. Whalan

The Physical and Health Education program at Harry Hooge is built using units of work that last between 3 and 7 weeks. Each unit focuses on specific categories of sports/games/activities such as Invasion games (hockey, basketball, netball, lacrosse etc.) and Net Wall games (Volleyball, Pickleball, Badminton). Our primary students focus on developing the fundamental movement skills associated with these sports such as the "underhand throw" which is used commonly across all Net Wall games. Meanwhile, our intermediate students dive deeper into the concepts used throughout these games, as well as skill development. During each unit of work, students must demonstrate interpersonal skills to be successful, along with the physical skill development. Students who demonstrate consistent skill (both interpersonal and physical) are rewarded at the end of each unit with a certificate of achievement. There are four categories of achievement, therefore four students across the primary grades, and four students from the intermediate grades achieve this level of esteem.

This past week saw the first transition from one complete unit to another. We finished Net Wall games and have now begun Invasion games. The eight winners have received their awards in front of their classmates and their photo proudly displayed in the gym to recognize their greatness. The four categories are broken down as follows:

MVP: To achieve MVP status, a student must demonstrate consistent:

- Sophisticated skill and effort
- Teamwork
- Inclusion
- Leadership

Captain: To be the captain, a student must demonstrate consistent:

- Outstanding leadership
- Teamwork
- Inclusion
- Encouragement of others

Hustling Hero: To earn this award, a student must demonstrate consistent:

- Resilience
- Outstanding effort
- Unwavering positivity

Ultimate Teammate: To earn the title of Ultimate Teammate, a student must demonstrate consistent:

- Teamwork
- Inclusion
- Positivity
- Selflessness

These awards are new to the students and when examples of these qualities are shown during class, they are reinforced as working towards these wonderful awards. Not all students will demonstrate the consistency to attain such awards, however this gives all students a target to aim at when striving for excellence in Physical Education. If your student comes home with one of these awards, this is a huge accomplishment and should be celebrated accordingly. Harry Hooge is proud of student achievement in all aspects of learning. We encourage all students to be active whenever possible to improve their overall health and well-being.
