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On September 29th many of our students and teachers wore orange to honour the thousands of Canadian aboriginal youth who suffered in residential schools in this country. The day was born out of Phyllis' story – a young girl who had her new orange shirt taken away on her first day at the residential school.

WITS is a pro-active program encouraging children to make safe and positive choices when faced with peer conflict.

The WITS acronym – Walk Away, Ignore, Talk It Out and Seek Help provides a common language that children and adults can use in their environment to solve social problems.

As per School District #42 Policy, staff may not administer medication to students unless appropriate forms are completed and signed by a parent. These forms should be filled out and returned to the school as soon as possible. If your child has a serious life threatening medical condition it is highly recommended they wear a Medical Alert Bracelet. Parking Procedures

At the expense of being repetitive, <u>please be respectful</u> of others while dropping off and picking up your <u>child(ren)</u>. We all recognize the frustration with the traffic congestion around the school, but <u>everyone</u> needs to be patient and behave in a courteous and <u>considerate manner</u>, not only to be good role models for our children, but to ensure their safety as well.

MORNING DROP OFF: DO NOT PARK IN THE DROP OFF ZONE AT THE SIDE OF THE SCHOOL AS YOU WAIT FOR THE MORNING BELL.

The morning drop-off time is a very busy time and although it may be more convenient for you to stop, parking in this area impedes the flow of traffic and makes it more difficult for others to drop off children. It is important that if you need to wait with your child before the morning bell, then you need to find a parking spot in the lot, or if none are available, on the roadside. (NOTE: Please have your child organized with all school items – this speeds up the drop off process).

Volunteers are needed to help with the gate from 1:50 to 2:30 daily. Hopefully we will get a few parents so it can be done on a rotation basis. Let the office know if you can help.

Volunteers in the School

We greatly appreciate the help we receive

from parents and grandparents. However, as volunteers you are in a position of trust and as such, it is essential that privacy and confidentiality are maintained. The children's safety is of prime concern to all of us. We ask that you respect the following guidelines:

- Everything you hear or see regarding students is confidential and should not be shared.
- If you cannot make your scheduled time please let the teacher know as soon as possible.
- Please sign in at the office and wear the volunteer tag provided to you. In the event of a fire alarm, please report to the secretary on the upper basketball court near the school gym.
- Treat all members of our school community with respect.
- If you are supervising students on a field trip -- keep a close eye on them, stay off your cell phone, and follow the expectations as established by the teacher at all times. We strongly request that no unofficial stops are made, such as stopping to treat the students to slurpees or ice cream.

Absent or Late to School?

If you know your child is going to be absent or late to school it is imperative to inform the office. Absences can be reported on the school voice mail, parent portal, or email KC_Reception@sd42.ca.

Safety is important to us and the phone home program is started as soon as possible to account for any missing students. Students who arrive to school *after the morning announcements* must report directly to the office for a late slip, which documents they have arrived safely. This avoids any problems as many teachers have already submitted attendance to the office with the student listed as absent. The last thing we want is to alarm a parent with a phone call saying their child is not at school when in fact they are here but forgot to get a late slip.

Please review the late sign in process with your child. If in doubt as to whether you are late or not, check in with the office.
