CLASS PLACEMENT FOR 2017/2018

It is not yet the time for parents to submit requests for class placements - this is done at the end of May (forms will be available on our website). This is an advance reminder regarding the process of submitting a request for next year's class placement. As per School District 42 expectations, please take note of the following:

- We do not accept requests for specific teachers. We do accept information about your child's learning styles that might help us make stronger placements.
- Please remember that our teachers have a rich amount of information about your child this information makes for strong class placements and is based on a yearlong experience
 with them.
- We cannot make placements based solely on friendships, especially if the social energy of the group is interfering with the classroom learning conditions.
- Teachers cannot make any guarantees about next year's class placements if teachers suggest a teacher for next year, please remember it is only a suggestion. With changes in staffing and fluctuating enrollment things can often change unexpectedly.
- Parent requests are one piece of the information we consider when placing students. We also have many other factors to consider and often our class placements are complex.
- Our ultimate goal is to create balanced classrooms that are beneficial for all.

Once again, please refer to the month end newsletter, should you be interested in submitting a request for your child's placement.

TRANSFER GUIDELINES:

Parents who wish to have their children in grades 1 to 7 transfer to another school for September must obtain a Student Transfer Request Form from their current school, complete the transfer form including signature, and have the current principal sign and date it. The current school retains the Student Transfer Request Form.

At the June 21st elementary principals meeting, all principals will bring all transfer request forms. Transfer decisions will be made at the meeting and when finalized the principal will contact parents. Acceptance criteria for prioritizing placements:

- 1. IN catchment with siblings already attending catchment school (proof of residence required) or displaced catchment siblings on district list
- 2. IN catchment (proof of residence required)
- 3. OUT of catchment with siblings
- 4. IN catchment daycare
- 5. OUT of catchment without siblings
- 6. OUT of district with siblings (Register at the District Education Office)
- 7. OUT of district without siblings

MORNING DROP OFF: <u>DO NOT PARK IN THE DROP OFF ZONE</u> AT THE SIDE
OF THE SCHOOL AS YOU WAIT FOR THE MORNING BELL. The morning drop-off
time is a very busy time and although it may be more convenient for you to stop here, parking in this
area impedes the flow of traffic and makes it more difficult for others to drop off their children.
It is important that if you need to wait with your child before the morning bell that you find a
parking spot in the lot, or if none are available, on the roadside. (NOTE: Please have your child
organized with all their school items - this speeds up the drop off process).

• AFTERNOON PICKUP: A few years ago, the traffic committee with the support of the RCMP, the City of Maple Ridge, and SD42 Health and Safety Department made the decision to close the school parking lot at approximately 2:00 p.m. except for parents picking up children with mobility issues and for daycares picking up a number of students. It has been brought to our attention more than once, that parents are blocking neighbours' driveways and being somewhat abusive when asked to move. Please respect our neighbours and DO NOT BLOCK DRIVEWAYS OR PARK ON OTHER PEOPLE'S PROPERTY. You must have a Kanaka Creek Parking Pass to enter the parking lot after school. Thank you for your support in this matter.

<u>VERY IMORTANT - CLASS PHOTOS AND YEARBOOKS</u> - are just around the corner. Please ensure you have given permission on the portal <u>for your child to appear in the yearbook and in class photos</u>. If you have not given permission, your child will not be able to be in the yearbook and/or class photo. If you are not sure if you have this or not, give us a call. A student without portal permission will not be able to participate in the class photo or panorama photo that will be taken on May 31st.




ANIMALS IN THE SCHOOL
