#### 2018 Kindergarten Registration

Please note Kindergarten registration for September 2018 begins on <u>January 4<sup>th</sup></u>, <u>2018</u> at 12:00 noon for families with siblings already registered at Kanaka (currently in Grades Kindergarten to 6) and will close at 11:59 pm on January 10<sup>th</sup>. All Kindergarten registrations will take place on-line and will be set up through the parent portal. If you do not have an available computer, we will provide access to one at the school or at the District Education Office.

As you know children with siblings in attendance at the school are given priority during the registration process. If you have already registered an older child on the portal, this will show up during the registration and you will be given priority, otherwise it will not acknowledge that the Kindergarten student you are registering has a sibling that attends Kanaka and you may lose out on priority placement.

#### **Parking Reminders**

It has been brought to our attention on more than one occasion that parents are blocking driveways of homes near the school and not being extremely co-operative when asked to move in order for the homeowner to enter/leave their driveway. Please be respectful of our neighbours and park legally.

To drop off your child(ren) please enter through the first white gate and exit through the north white gate on 234A Street or the gate on Gilker Hill. The road is ONE WAY. If you use the "drop off" area, please remain in your vehicle. Please find parking on Kanaka Way or 234A Street. Passes for daycare vans and for families dropping off students with mobility issues are required prior to 2:20.

Please take some time to consider the "Drive to 5" program, which is to have a prearranged spot that is five minutes from the school where you can drop off and pick up your child(ren). The goal of this initiative is to develop a healthier school, reduce the emissions and congestion from vehicles in our parking lot and make walking or cycling to school a safe and fun event.

#### **Emergency Student Release Forms**

In January, your child(ren) will come home with emergency release forms. This is to ensure we have a robust way to release your son/daughter to someone you've given authorization for in the event of an emergency. For some families, parents will be unable to get back to the school in a timely manner if we needed to release the students because of a natural disaster. Thus, it is important to have names of people who live close to the school and are available during the day in case this occurred. Please see Mr. Raible for more details.
