2018 Kindergarten Registration

Please note that Kindergarten registration for September 2018 for families with siblings already registered at Kanaka (currently in Grades Kindergarten to 6) has closed. If you missed this registration period you will have to register in the general phase that opens on February 1st at noon. All Kindergarten registrations will take place on-line and will be set up through the parent portal. If you do not have a computer available to you, we will provide access to one at the school. Please visit http://www1.sd42.ca/kindergarten-registration for more information.

2018 Grade 8 Registration

Registration for grade 8 for the 2018/19 school year will be done on the parent portal. Online registration starts Thursday, Feb 15th at 12:00 noon and closes 11:59 pm on March 2, 2018.

Parents who miss the March 2 online deadline must complete a paper registration form at their catchment school. Parents will be notified after Spring Break of their child's high school placement. Parents wishing to transfer school must complete a transfer request form at the assigned school. A review of these transfer requests will be completed before the grade 7 orientation in May. The online registration form will automatically populate with your child's secondary catchment school. This is determined by your address (not your elementary school). You can check the School District website http://www.sd42.ca for your catchment school. Please note that new development areas may not reflect accurate results of your catchment school. Please call and confirm with the school if necessary. Families will be able to request their first three choices of schools. Registration numbers are limited by capacity. Details regarding acceptance criteria can be found on the SD42 website.

In the past, there have been informational nights at the high schools. These will be done AFTER your son/daughter is placed. However, there are a few sessions for specialized programs (environmental program at THSS, students in Learning Services, IB program) that will be having informational sessions:

Parking Reminders

It has been brought to our attention on more than one occasion that parents are blocking driveways of homes near the school and not being extremely co-operative when asked to move in order for the homeowner to enter/leave their driveway. <u>Please be respectful of our neighbours and park legally.</u>

To drop off your child(ren) please enter through the first white gate and exit through the north white gate on 234A Street or the gate on Gilker Hill. <u>The road is ONE WAY</u>. If you use the "drop off" area, please remain in your vehicle. Please find parking on Kanaka Way or 234A Street. Passes for daycare vans and for families dropping off students with mobility issues are required prior to 2:20.

Please take some time to consider the "Drive to 5" program, which is to have a prearranged spot that is five minutes from the school where you can drop off and pick up your child(ren). The goal of this initiative is to develop a healthier school, reduce the emissions and congestion from vehicles in our parking lot and make walking or cycling to school a safe and fun event.

Late Immersion Program

The SD42 Late French Immersion Program is an excellent opportunity for students who want to learn a second language or are looking for a challenge. Students who are currently in grade 5 are eligible to begin Late French Immersion in September 2018 at Golden Ears Elementary School. This two-year elementary program continues at Maple Ridge Secondary School. A teacher from the program will be coming to Kanaka to speak to grade 5 students on January 24 at 8:30 am. STUDENT TRANSFER GUIDELINES: ELEMENTARY 2018/19

TRANSFER PHASE 1

Transfer Phase 1 takes place between February 14, 2018 and April 4, 2018.

To participate in Transfer Phase 1 for your current kindergarten to Grade 6 child for September 2018, obtain a **Student Transfer Request Form** from your child's current SD42 school and submit the completed and signed form to your child's current principal. If your child is new to the school district, use the school locator to find your child's catchment school (http://www.sd42.ca/school-locator/), then complete a registration form at that school.

Parents of students who reside out of district should contact the district office at 604.463.4200 for assistance.

The best chance to transfer schools is during Transfer Phase 1.

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA FOR PLACEMENT:

- 1. In-catchment with siblings already attending catchment school (proof of residence required) or displaced catchment siblings on district list;
- 2. In-catchment (proof of residence required);
- 3. Out-of-catchment with siblings;
- 4. In-catchment daycare;
- 5. Out-of-catchment without siblings;
- 6. Out-of-district with siblings (register at the District Education Office);
- 7. Out-of-district without siblings.
- Parents will be notified about placement decisions no later than April 13, 2018

TRANSFER PHASE 2

Transfer Phase 2 takes place between **April 5, 2018** and **June 20, 2018**. The process for Transfer Phase 2 is the same as for Transfer Phase 1 (see Transfer Phase 1). *The chance of a successful transfer in Transfer Phase 2 is less likely than in Transfer Phase 1*.

Parents will be notified about placement decisions no later than June 27, 2018

TRANSFER PHASE 3

Transfer Phase 3 takes place between **June 21, 2018** and **August 30, 2018**. The process for Transfer Phase 3 is the same as for Transfer Phase 1 (see Transfer Phase 1). *The chance of a successful transfer in Transfer Phase 3 is less likely than in phases 1 and 2*.

Parents will be notified about placement decisions no later than August 31, 2018

Core Competencies: What are they and why are they in the new curriculum? The new curriculum centres around the following three core competency areas: **communication**, **personal and social, thinking.** They are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning. Competencies are evident in every area of learning and in every grade, and come into play when students become actively engaged in their learning. During the school year, students will have an opportunity to self-assess their proficiencies in these core competencies.
