2018/19 Transfer Guidelines

These guidelines apply to students who want to:

- Transfer to Kanaka Creek from another school in Maple Ridge / Pitt Meadows
- Transfer out of Kanaka Creek to another school in Maple Ridge / Pitt Meadows

Parents need to go to their current school to request a student transfer form. The current school will keep this form. There will be a series of three meetings to decide on transfer requests in the months of April, June, and August. Once decisions have been made at these meetings, parents will be phoned to let them know. Families who move into a school catchment need to go to that school to register. If they are hoping to attend a different school, they can indicate this on their registration form.

In general, acceptance criteria for prioritizing new registrations are:

- Students who live in catchment
- Students who live out of catchment with siblings already in the school
- Out of catchment without siblings
- Out of District with siblings
- Out of District without siblings

Grade 8 Registration

All Grade 8 online registration must be completed by noon on **March 2, 2018**. Date and time will be a factor after catchment and sibling students are placed. When a school is declared full if registration did not occur by March 2, 2018, students may not get their catchment school. Parents will be notified after Spring Break as to where their child is assigned.

Movement between schools after March 2 deadline requires a transfer process. Transfer forms are available at all secondary schools.

The ability to transfer will be limited by building space and available staffing. See Student Transfer Guidelines.

A review of transfer requests will be completed before the Grade 7 orientation date in May. Individual meetings and/or visits will occur after placement

Parking Lot - Safety First

We still are having many parents/caregivers choosing to disregard our signage around the building:

The Drop Off area at the front of the building should only be for families who are dropping off their older children and don't need to leave their cars. You should only be in this area for 10-15 seconds maximum. If you need to walk with your child and wait with them at their door, please park on Kanaka Way and walk on to the property.

The Fire Lane near the Flag Poles - This area is only for daycare providers and parents with students with disabilities who **have the school parking pass**. Cars in this area should always have someone in them to be able to move them quickly should an emergency occur.

Core Competencies

The new curriculum has a component called the core competencies. These need to be reflected on annually and embrace big ideas that encompass a number of curricular areas. These competencies are in Communication, Personal/Social Responsibility, and Critical/Creative Thinking. Once per year, students need to reflect on their work and find examples where they are showing a particular competency. For example, the Communication Competency encompasses statements such as: Effectively communicates and share ideas. Engages respectfully in dialogue with others, Contributes to lessons, activities and discussions, Communicates in a variety of ways and settings. Students can highlight group projects, presentations, class discussions, and a host of other activities to show that they've met this competency. For more details, visit:

COLLABORATIVE LEARNING

ollaborative learning is an educational approach to teaching and learning that involves groups of students working together to solve a problem, complete a task, or create a product. This approach requires students to be highly engaged in their learning, with a focus on process rather than on the right answer.

Students are expected to come prepared to discuss and collaborate. Teachers build in accountability with group marks and individual student assessments. Students teach each other through working on challenging class problems with the teacher as facilitator or coach. The goal is to shift learning from teacher-centered to a student-centered model.

Core Competencies: What are they and why are they in the new curriculum?

The new curriculum centres around the following three core competency areas: **communication**, **personal and social**, **thinking**. They are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning. Competencies are evident in every area of learning and in every grade, and come into play when students become actively engaged in their learning. During the school year, students will have an opportunity to self-assess their proficiencies in these core competencies.
