#### **Class Placements for September**

In the past week or so we have had a number of parents express concern about their child's placement for next year. We do value parents' input in regards to the learning environment that would best suit their child which is why we asked that you put this information in writing before June 1. Building classes for the fall takes a significant amount of time and thought. We have many variables to consider; boy to girl ratio, academic ability, social and emotional levels, work habits, behaviour, and of course, who does and doesn't work well together. We try very hard to balance all of these factors and to ensure that it is the best learning environment for ALL students. We do see the importance of having at least one friend for each child placed together, particularly for children that can become anxious easily. However, it is not the sole factor we consider. In fact, it can be beneficial for children to meet and interact with as many of their peers as possible. Existing friendships can still be fostered and maintained on the playground and outside of school time.

#### **Final Term Report Cards**

Report cards were issued either by way of the Parent Portal or by paper copy. You will notice some differences between our final term report and our previous (term 1 and term 2) reports. In our previous terms, students were involved in a "three way" conference with parents and teachers to celebrate their successes, and establish goals for the next term. In this process, students showcased a portfolio of work, and engaged in conversations regarding their strengths and areas of improvement.

In our final term, there will be no formal conference. Instead, teachers will be sending home a final report. Please check out the SD42 website for further information on our reporting model.

#### September 2018 School Start Up Info

The August break will go by very quickly, and we'd like to provide you with this information to better prepare you and your children for the September start-up.

#### <u>September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018 – school is in session from</u> 8:30am-11:00am:

School re-opens for the 2018-2019 school year on Tuesday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at 8:30am for all grade 1-7 students. School will be in session <u>until 11:00 am</u>, at which time the students will be dismissed. Students will need a recess snack and their pencil storage box with basic writing and coloring supplies. <u>Please do not send the full complement of your child's school supplies on this first half day.</u>

**Students returning to Kanaka Creek**: are to "line up" at the designated entry doorway of their 2017-2018 classroom. Each class will be greeted by their current teacher (or an alternate staff member) and the students will spend the morning in their old classroom, or if this is not available, another area of the school. Starting the school year this way will allow students to share their summer experiences with their current teacher and classmates, and allow us the appropriate time to confirm enrollment before announcing class placements.

Students who have newly registered at Kanaka Creek: can go directly to the Library where they will be temporarily assigned to a grade appropriate classroom. Parents are welcome to stay until their children are comfortable. <u>They will be dismissed from the Library</u> <u>at 11:00 am.</u>

**Students who have not yet registered**: are to go directly to the office.

### <u>September 5<sup>th</sup> 2018</u>-school is in session from 8:30am-2:20pm

All students are to return to the same classroom as on Tuesday, September 4<sup>th</sup>. Students will be informed via the classroom teacher and parent portal as to when to bring their school supplies.

#### **The First Week**

Our students will not be moving into their new classrooms immediately after the break. For several reasons, we may not be able to organize students into "final" classes until Friday (we need an accurate count for our enrollment, organization, and staffing). Please ensure you have a pre-arranged pick up spot until class placements are finalized. While students will be with their last year's teacher, it is still a valuable time of learning. Often, teachers pick up where they were 4 weeks ago with learning opportunities. Please ensure your children are attending that first week.
