


Pink Shirt Day February 24th

Active Travel to School


The concept of "Active Transportation," is gaining prominence and we see many people leaving their cars at home. Please have a look at the information below from public health: http://www.vch.ca/public-health/children-youth-schools/school-health/active-travel-to-school

Active kids are healthy kids. Children who are more physically active are happier, have better academic achievement, have fewer depression and anxiety related symptoms, sleep better, and have better overall health. Active travel (walking, biking, etc.) is a great way for kids to be

physically active. Using active modes of travel to and from school and other destinations in the community has a host of benefits for kids' well-being and development. It also has effects that benefit the broader community such as more socially cohesive neighbourhoods, safer streets and cleaner air.

How much physical activity do children need?

The Canadian 24-hour movement guidelines recommend that children and youth aged 5-17 get at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity and several hours of a variety of structured and unstructured light physical activity per day.
