# **School Supplies**

If your child will be in **Grade 4-7** next year, please check the school website for information on how to purchase school supplies. There are 2 options: purchasing the supplies yourself or purchasing through Creative Packs. For more info visit the school website:

https://elementary.sd42.ca/mapleridge/school-supplies-lists/ Many classes will also be using school planners (agendas) which cost \$10.00.



**Kindergarten and Grades 1-3** – supplies will be bulk ordered by teachers. In September, you can pay on the portal or by cheque made out to Maple Ridge Elementary. The cost is \$50 for kindergarten students and \$55 for Grades 1-3.

If your family is experiencing financial constraints that make purchasing school supplies challenging, you may be eligible to receive a Salvation Army school supply backpack. These backpacks come filled with the necessary school supplies free of charge and will be delivered to the school in September. 
