Course Planning "I'm going into Grade 11/12"

Here is what is happening over the next three class visits:

- Visit #1: Practice Sheets, Course Info & questions.
- Visit #2: Review information / answer questions and hand in a draft copy of your selections.
- Visit #3: Counsellor pick up your final copy of your course selection sheet and enter data.

Course Planning "I'm going into Grade 11/12!"

- Students in grade 11 and 12 at MRSS must take 8 courses.
- Students may take more than 8 courses by taking a course in Block I (outside the regular timetable).
- If you are carrying an I block this does give you a "free" block in the regular day.

MRSS Course Requirements

There are some courses that you MUST take in your grade 11/12 year

The BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete a MINIMUM of 80 credits during grades 10, 11 and 12 in order to graduate (a total of 20 courses at the Grade 10, 11 & 12 level). All courses are 4 credits.

Grade 12 students MUST successfully complete either English First Peoples Literary Studies & Writing 11, English First Peoples 12 or BC First Peoples 12 to meet new grad requirement of 4 credits with an Indigenous focus.

Note: Most MRSS students graduate with 92 credits.

Core Courses

GRADE 11's:

- English First Peoples 11, Composition 11,
 Creative Writing 11 or New Media 11
- 2. A Math PreCalc 11/ Foundations 11 / WPM 11
- 3. A Science 11 **OR** 12
- 4. A Social Studies 11 **OR** 12 French Immersion students will take Histoire 12
- 5. French Immersion students will take Langue et Culture de la Francophonie 11
- 6. Career Life Education 10

Core Courses

GRADE 12's:

- English First Peoples 12, English Studies 12 (regular, foundations or AP)
- 2. A minimum of 3 other courses at the grade 12 level must be on your transcript
- 3. French Immersion students will take Francais Langue 12 AND Conversation 12
- 4. You need to ensure you are covering the new grad requirement 4 credits of an Indigenous focus course

Math Program

1. Workplace Math 11

- Works as a graduation credit
- Post-secondary admission Douglas College / UFV / some trade programs

2. Foundations of Math 11 & 12

 Generally, for students who are planning to apply to Bachelor of Arts Programs at the Post-Secondary level. (Anything not Science related.)

3. PreCalculus 11 & 12

 Generally, for students who are planning to apply to Bachelor of Science programs at the Post-Secondary level. (and some Business Programs)

Elective Courses

- Remaining electives can be anything BUT you should be looking at post-secondary entrance requirements for programs that may be of interest and filling in those requirements as your electives.
- A second language is not required for graduation but may be required for post secondary. This may be one of your electives.
 - UBC regular grade 11 language required
 - SFU will require an Intro 11 language course
- A Language 12 may cover a degree requirement at some university programs (i.e. UBC)
- A support class counts as one of these electives.

Elective Choices

 Talk to older peers, teachers, counsellors if you are having trouble making a decision.

It is important to have at least 2 ALTERNATE
 COURSE REQUESTS — just in case a first
 choice course is not offered due to low
 enrollment or there are not enough seats
