#### **FULL DAY VISIT - MAY 21**

Students should plan to arrive a MRSS at the GYM entrance (at the west side of the school) between 8:00 - 8:20 with their timetable and map. If they forget their timetable, need a map, or have questions, they should come to the office and we'll help. They will need to bring a snack, a notebook, pen & pencil and gym strip if PE is on their timetable.

We start with an assembly in the main gym at 8:30. After the assembly they will attend the classes on their timetable. We'll provide lunch for them (or they can bring their own if they prefer). Attendance will be taken in each class so, if they are going to be away, please make sure to advise us by calling the school at 604 463-4175.

Our day will end between 2:00-2:15pm. Make sure to have made plans for pick up in advance.

#### LINK CREW - GRADE 8 MENTORS

MRSS has a group of senior students who are part of a 'mentoring team' or 'buddy system' called LINK Crew. LINK Crew members receive leadership training so they are equipped to provide support and to plan unique activities for our Grade 8 students throughout the school year. Your student will be linked up with 1 or 2 LINK Crew members for the entire school year as a support system! They will meet their LINK Crew member(s) for the first time at orientation day at the end August, the week before school starts, and will keep in touch throughout the year doing various activities.

#### PLANNING FOR SUCCESS

At MRSS our Grade 8 students use a paper planner to help organize their day and week. Additionally, we encourage students and families to download our planner app from the App Store (it's free and safe to use). You can enter your student's timetable and always know what classes they have on any given day. And, you can see what's going on in our calendar at the touch of a screen. We'll send this information home with your student at the orientation in August.

# GRADE 8 ORIENTATION DAY Thursday, August 28

We start the day at 9:00am with an assembly after which our LINK Crew take over with all kinds of events and orientation activities to help ease your student's transition and familiarize them with the school.

They'll also be given their timetable and are welcome and encouraged to spend some time finding their classrooms once we are done.



We anticipate that all incoming Grade 8 students will attend. We'll send out more information closer to school opening.

Things to consider:

- Students should dress comfortably and appropriately for school

# FRENCH IMMERSION COMMITTMENT

We want to confirm with parents of students who have enrolled in our French Immersion program that you have committed your child to pursue their entire Grade 8 year in the French Immersion program.

Transfers to the English stream will not be permitted during the school year.

If you have changed your mind and now wish your child to study in the English stream, they will be removed from MRSS and placed at their catchment school for Grade 8 if you do not live in our English catchment area. You can request a transfer back to Maple Ridge Secondary but there are no guarantees of acceptance.

# INTRODUCTION TO ELECTIVE COURSES

In Grade 8 we give our students the opportunity to try different courses that they may not have been exposed to. This helps to prepare them for future years when they have the opportunity to pick elective courses. Students don't get to pick which of these courses they might like to try but rather they cycle through 4 six-week mini-courses. We call these our Explorations and Discovery courses. The courses include: Art, Drama, Computers, Foods, Music, and Textiles.

We also expose our Grade 8s' to languages in similar rotation. Students will take French, as well as an introduction to Japanese and Spanish.

Students interested in Band and/or Choir will take these courses all year long. If any of these three courses may interest your student, plan to speak with our Grade 8 counsellor for more information.
