

	The Aboriginal Education Department is hosting a short presentation <u>on September</u> <u>30th</u> in honour of Residential School survivors and those that were lost. The aim of this presentation is to discuss the legacy of Residential schools and highlight the importance of Orange Shirt Day.
Aborigianl Education	With the last school closing in 1996, the impact of the residential schools is deeply felt by the Indigenous community. More than 150,000 Indigenous, Métis and Inuit children attended these schools. There are an estimated 80,000 survivors living today. The intergeneration trauma created by these schools impacting thousands more.
	By taking the time to discuss the history and culture of our land, we hope to help students understand what was lost and the resilience of those we honour by wearing an orange shirt.
