SCHOLARSHIPS/BURSARIES

- Bursaries based on financial need and are not to be paid back.
- Scholarships are applied for and awarded. Community involvement is very important.
- Local scholarship process begins in January. (consistent in district)
- Workshops will be organized and held in the new year.
- Post-secondary scholarships on web-sites.
- All awards have their own criteria.
- Begin the gathering of information early. Lots of help available in Career Center.

DISTRICT AUTHORITY AWARDS

- \$1250 awarded to grade 12 students who excel in Applied Skills, Languages, Athletics, Community Service, Technical and Trades Training and Fine Arts.
- Students present skills to a committee who determine awards based on a set criteria.
- Number of winners vary each year, usually around 25 per school. BEST ODDS
- Must have a grade 12 course in subject area!!

DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIPS

- Community donated money
- Criteria varies by donor
- District committee chooses all winners, although some donors choose their own winners.
- All awards are offered to all high schools in the city.
- Booklet will be available in the new year.
- 2-3 noon hour sessions to walk students through process.
- Application deadline in March before Spring Break for most awards.
- Winners announced on Grad Day in June.

Two B.C. students win \$150,000 scholarships

Unlike so many graduating highschoolers, Tristan Downing of Surrey isn't struggling with the decision over where he's going to school in the fall or how he's going to pay for it. Downing, 17, learned Friday that he is one of three recipients of the Blyth

Cambridge Commonwealth Trust Scholarship — the most valuable award available in Canada to pursue an undergraduate degree. "I'm thrilled," Tristan said Sunday. "I think the news still hasn't really sunk in."

The scholarship is worth about \$150,000 and will cover tuition, living expenses and travel for three years between Canada and any college at Cambridge University in England.

Tristan, whose marks last year in the International Baccalaureate program translated into a 97-per-cent average, intends to study engineering at Cambridge's Pembroke College.

"I think I'm well suited to engineer-

ing," he said. "It's a tangible way of making an impact on the world where help is needed."

Tristan said the work done by Engineers Without Borders was "inspiring." Another winner of the scholarship is also from B.C.

Chloe Houle-Johnson attends Lester B. Pearson United World College in Victoria. She intends to study land economy, also at Pembroke College.

The other Blyth winner is James Rickards from Colonel By Secondary in Greely, Ont. He intends to study

mathematics at Cambridge's Trinity College.

The scholarship is jointly funded by Blyth Scholarship and the Cambridge Commonwealth Trust. Blyth Scholarship chairman Sam Blyth graduated from Cambridge and has been helping send fellow Canadians to the school for more than 10 years.

Affiliates of Cambridge have won more Nobel Prizes than any other institution in the world.

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION AVERAGES

- Averages change from year to year students are encouraged to apply if they meet minimum averages.
- Averages are based on the grade 12 courses required for entry into the university program. Universities look at Grade 11 marks as well.
- Some universities used broad-based admissions. UBC and SFU have moved to this method. This means admission is based on marks, school and community service, and extra-curricular activities. This is an additional part of the regular admission application. Five written parts- very important to do this well.

CHANGES TO UBC /SFU ENTRANCE

UBC

- Required for entrance from high school:
- 1. high average (90's ?) in SIX academic courses
- 2. Well answered broad based questions
- Now, will take into consideration ALL grade 12 courses, as well as grade 11 academic courses.

SFU

- Required for entrance from high school:
- 1. High average (mid 80's?) in FIVE academic courses.
- 2. System where some courses are prioritized over others (Tier 1 and Tier 2)
- 3. Different programs require different combinations from the two tiers.

UNIVERSITY TRANSFER OPTION

- Many students choose to visit a college first before heading to University. Students do this because:
 - College is often cheaper and saves money.
 - Classes are often smaller and more supportive.
 - It makes for an easier transition.
 - Colleges are often closer to home.
 - Teaching is tailored more to student needs.
- Students may take up to 60 SFU credits (3 credit courses) or up to 30 UBC credits (1.5 credit courses) on a University transfer program.
- This is usually 2 years of full-time study.

- Be well aware of deadlines and give yourself lots and lots of time for submissions.
- Parents- GET INVOLVED

THINKING ABOUT THE FUTURE

- A few facts to consider when thinking about postsecondary:
 - Over 50% of students today will be self-employed, or work for themselves.
 - Over our lifetimes, it is predicted that the average Canadian will change careers seven times on average.
 - Some of the most popular jobs today did not exist five years ago. Top jobs that will be found five years from now likely do not exist as we will come to know them.

- Apply to a college early to ensure you have somewhere to go.
- If a student is getting behind or getting poor marks here, what will happen at university?
- University professors do not use the words "deal" or "plan" when it comes to students who fail to hand in work on time.
- Unless your child has a high "B" or "A" average in academic grade 12 courses, the chances of being accepted in a major university (UBC, SFU) are very slim to nil. Local colleges or smaller universities are a great option for a year or two (and cheaper).
- GO ONLINE FOR REPORT CARDS EACH TERM, CHECK ALL GRADES, AND DON'T FORGET ON-LINE COURSES.
