

What is a Great Hall?

A Great Hall or GH is a large work area for students. This is a unique concept only available at THSS! There may be more than one teacher there helping students. There will be seating for many students. Some Great Halls are very large and some are smaller.

In a Great Hall, there will be students from different grades. Great Halls are sometimes referred to as "work areas".

Can you name THSS' Great Halls??

What is an Open Block?

An open block is a block in which you are not scheduled into a class during the school day – as with Y block on Mondays. Open blocks are sometimes called 'work blocks' or 'free blocks'.

Open blocks are instructional time – this means it is time when you are supposed to be in the school building working with an adult on your course work. Even though open blocks are not "a class" these blocks are school time and require you to be present in a Great Hall.

What do you do during a Great Hall or open block?

During a GH block or open block you are expected to work in one of the areas in our school on your course work. You need to check in with the teacher that is in the Great Hall or Open Block with you. You can check in by saying hello or by telling the teacher you are there to see them. There are many things you can do during an open block. You can take a test or do a science lab. You can finish a textiles project or work on an English assignment. You can read a novel or watch a math video. You can do

an interview or review material before a test. You can edit a piece of writing or show a teacher what you have so far and get feedback on that.

What you do in an open block is determined by your course load and your assigned work.

These blocks are designed to let you decide what you should work on. These blocks give you an opportunity to work with a teacher one-on-one. You can also work with peers on a group project or on an assignment.

During a Great Hall or Open block:

- o Have all necessary materials you need handouts, paper, pencils, laptop, etc
- o Minimize your distractions like devices or chatty friends
- o Set a goal for yourself at the start of the block

For instance: 'During this open block I will read 5 pages from my novel' OR 'I will ask my teacher what work I need to do this week and do that'

o Behave as you would in a class – respect the space and those around you.
