Student Schedules

Course/Class Change Process

What do I do if I need to change one of my courses?

Students can pick up a change request form during TA and drop it off at the counselling office. Updated schedules will be returned to TA boxes and distributed during morning TA. Counsellors are unavailable to meet for individual schedule changes during the first week of school. **Friday, September 13th is the course change deadline.**

Cell Phone Use Changes

This year, there are some important updates to our school's cell phone policy, effective immediately. These changes are in alignment with the new regulations mandated by the Province of British Columbia. The growing concern around student mental health, particularly in relation to the extensive use of social media, has driven these necessary adjustments to ensure that the Thomas Haney Secondary learning environment supports the well-being and academic success of all students. This is a significant shift for our school as we rely heavily on TEAMS for classroom assignments, learning guides & communication. This big shift will take some time but it is a healthy move for the well-being of our students to strike a better balance with their use of technology during the school day.

The book The Anxious Generation by Jonathon Haidt has created a lot of conversations amongst educators and parents about the detrimental effects of excessive technology use on youth in their most formative years of cognitive and social development. I encourage you to read it if you have the opportunity. If you are interested in this topic, there is an article called, Lessons From "The Anxious Generation" For Educators and Parents (LINK to ARTICLE) that may be of interest to you.

New Thomas Haney Secondary School Cell Phone Policy Overview:

In Scheduled Classes and Teacher Advisory:

Students will only be permitted to use their cell phones if directed by the teacher for learning purposes. This ensures that technology is used as a tool to enhance education rather than a distraction.

In Great Halls:

Students may only use their phones if the use is connected to learning activities. Unsupervised use of cell phones for non-academic purposes will no longer be allowed in these areas.

Before School, Between Classes & Lunch:

Ideally students will manage their online time in an appropriate manner before and after school and between classes and lunch time. However during these times students will not be restricted from using their phones as long as it aligns with our school's code of conduct around appropriate use of technology.

Addressing Non-Adherence:

To help students manage their learning environment without the distraction of cell phones, we will implement a series of progressive steps if the policy is not followed. These steps will culminate in communication with parents/guardians and the

development of a plan to ensure that each student is able to stay focused on their education.

Teacher Advisory (TA)

Please note that unless a student has an administration approved work at home form, attendance during TA is required. TA starts at 8:30 and it is our expectation that students arrive on time. All students are required to maintain a daily plan using our paper planner and there is a space each week where a parent can initial to show that they have reviewed their child's plan. Our goal is that the planner is a useful tool for both students and parents. TA is a pillar of our school. Our staff values this time to build positive relationships with our students and to help guide and support them in their daily and weekly planning, but also in their development as a self-directed learner. There is a direct correlation and connection between the academic and social success of our students and TA attendance.

Reporting Student Absence

All student absences must be excused by a parent or legal guardian or they will be recorded as "unexcused," and parents will be contacted by the autodialer. Absences reported to teachers may not be excused in our system, so be sure to contact the office in one of the following ways:

- Log into the <u>parent portal</u> and click the "Report Absence" tab. Select your child's name from the drop-down menu. Enter the date of the absence, or the date that the student will be arriving late or leaving early, as well as any other relevant details. **This is the preferred method to report an absence**
- Call the school directly at 604-463-2001
- Send a signed note with your student to the office prior to, or upon return from, an absence.
- Visit the office in person

Work at home applications will be available from the office for students in grades 11 and 12 during the first week of school. These applications are to be filled out and returned to administration for consideration. Only students that have demonstrated consistent work habits and achievement across all report cards last year will be considered
