

Consent to take students on walking activity off school grounds

From time to time, there are instructional reasons to take students off the school grounds on a walking activity such as: collecting leaves for art in the fall, walking to the local grocery store to collect information for a math unit etc. These activities would be supervised by the teacher and another staff member as the minimum level of supervision. These activities are short in duration (less than an hour) and occur as an obvious but impromptu outgrowth of the class activity.

Teachers will seek permission of the principal to conduct the activity and inform the office when they leave, the destination, and the expected return time.

Students are expected at all times to behave in a safe and appropriate manner by following the School's Code of Conduct.

As you know, accidents can be the result of the nature of any activity and can occur with or without any fault on either part of the student or the School Board or its employees or agents or the facility where the activity is taking place. By allowing your child to participate in this activity, you are accepting the risk of an accident occurring, and agree that the activity, as described above, is suitable for your child.

Inherent risks of this activity may include but are not limited to: tripping and falling
