The **communication competency** encompasses the set of abilities that students use to impart and exchange information, experiences and ideas, to explore the world around them, and to understand and effectively engage in the use of digital media. Development of this competency focuses on four key areas: connecting and engaging with others; acquiring, interpreting and presenting information; collaborating to plan, carry out and review constructions and activities; and explain, recount and reflect on experiences and accomplishments.

The new curriculum centres around the following three core competency areas: **communication, personal and social, thinking.** They are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning. Competencies are evident in every area of learning and in every grade, and come into play when students become

actively engaged in their learning. During the school year, students will have an opportunity to self-assess their proficiencies in these core competencies.

HOW TO REPORT AN ABSENCE THROUGH THE PARENT PORTAL:

- Log into your Parent Portal account (http://parents.sd42.ca) and click on the "Report Absence" tab in the main menu.
- Select your linked child from the drop down menu. Your child's grade and division will automatically appear.
- 3. Select the days of absence and provide the school with a reason for the absence and any other information you feel is relevant.
- Click on the "Submit" button. The system will send a notification email to the school, and will also send a confirmation email to the email address linked to your Parent Portal account.

If you are reporting your child's absence through the Parent Portal, you do not need to call the school.
