GRADE 8 REGISTRATION

Grade 7 to 8 Student Registration

Registration opens at 12 p.m. (noon) on Thursday, February 4, 2021. All Grade 8 registrations are done through the Parent Portal at https://parents.sd42.ca. Each registration is time-stamped at the moment the registration form is opened to begin the online registration process. Deadline for Grade 8 online registration is 12 p.m. (noon) on February 19, 2021. If you do not register your child by the online registration deadline, you will need to complete a paper registration form at your child's catchment high school. Parents will be notified by email before Spring Break about their child's assigned school.

VALENTINE CARDS

Valentine card exchange is permitted as long as the cards are basic paper cards (cards with pens, stickers or candies are NOT permitted at this time). The virus is not transmitted on paper, but can be transmitted on the attached items such as pens, stickers, and candies.

HOMEMADE BAKED GOODS

Schools and district buildings can not allow homemade food items available to students or staff at this time (e.g. birthday treats, bake sale items, candy-grams, PAC lunches, potluck staff lunches, holiday baking, etc.).

Only individually prepared and packaged commercial items are acceptable (Safety Plan and Handbook for Staff, p. 36). If parents wish to contribute goodies, they must come in an unopened box to the classroom teacher for distribution. Classroom teacher will wash hands and distribute to each child if they are participating in such an activity.



WEST COAST RECESS

At Webster's Corners, like other schools in the District, we have a West Coast recess. We feel it's important that our students play outside, get fresh air and plenty of exercise. Due to the often-wet conditions of our climate, it is important that children have a hooded jacket or umbrella and waterproof footwear. Please also ensure that your child has a complete change of clothes at school. Unless we experience an especially torrential downpour or very cold weather, we will all be enjoying the outdoors at recess and lunch breaks.

ADVISING US OF ABSENT OR LATE STUDENTS

If your child is going to be absent or late for any reason, please remember to inform us via the portal or email the school at wce_reception@sd42.ca. You may also phone in the absence to 604-462-7595. An answering machine is available 24 hours a day, 7 days per week for your convenience.

Arriving late for school in our current context will be extremely challenging to manage; as such, we ask that you ensure your child arrives for the 8:30 am welcome by your child's teacher at their designated meeting location. If your child does arrive late for school, they are to report to the main entrance and knock on the door. A staff member will let them into the office for attendance purposes.

NUT AWARE

The Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows School District, while not being able to guarantee an allergen-free environment in its schools, will take reasonable steps to provide an allergysafe and allergy-aware environment for students with life-threatening allergies. As we have several students at Webster's who have life-threatening allergies to nuts (peanuts and tree nuts), we ask your cooperation in keeping the classrooms safe for all students by choosing snack and lunch foods for your children that are nut-free. The welcome bell will ring at 8:25. All students are asked to line up outside their classroom doors, or in the outside zones for their particular classrooms where their teachers will greet them in the morning. We request that students arrive at school, no sooner than 5 - 10 minutes before the 8:25 a.m. bell. This request is made out of concern for your child's safety and security, since there is no supervision available before school starts. MEDICAL INTERVENTION FORM

If your child requires the administration of medication it is imperative that you fill out a "Medical Intervention Form" before any medication can be dispensed. This form is available on our website. The school cannot assist with any medication unless this form is completed. Children are not permitted to bring any medication of any kind to school to be taken by themselves. Please DO NOT send any prescriptions or over-the-counter medication to school with your child without contacting the office first. For safety reasons, all medications must be in their ORIGINAL CONTAINER and will be stored in a locked cupboard in the office. A record is kept of all amounts given to any child. This procedure complies with Board policy regarding medications to be taken at school.
