STEM UPDATE 2.0 FROM MRS. LANE

In September 2021, we converted our school's Multipurpose room into a Stem Lab. In this space, students take part in various Science, Technology, Engineering and Math activities, which are tied to the British Columbia ADST Curriculum.

Each class visits the lab 1-2 times per week with the Prep Teacher, Mrs. Lindsay Lane. Some of the activities we have experienced over the past few months include:

Science: Mentos and Coke eruption, Magic Milk experiment, Introduction to circuits

Coding and Technology: Scratch and Scratch Jr. coding programs, Robot Mice, Dash Robots, Star Wars Spheros

Engineering challenges: Building the tallest tower out of straws, folding paper airplanes Math: Measuring various amounts of water for a water bottle flipping competition.

In October, McDonalds raised over \$5000 on McHappy Day for us to purchase Lego Spike kits. With these kits, students will be able to build their own robots and use iPads to program them. Our goal this year is to update our school's iPads as many of them are not compatible with this newer technology.
