Important School News

WELCOME NEW STAFF: We are happy to have the following new staff members join us this year: Mrs. Kieneker (Job share in Div. 4) with Ms. Long, Ms. McGreevy (Prep), Ms. Gill (Job share in Div.11/Support), Ms. Nelson (Div. 2), Ms. Pennell (Div. 5), Mrs. Jennings (Secretary).

MEDICAL FORMS: If your child has any health care needs that require support at school, including the administration of any medications, medical forms <u>must</u> be completed. The school cannot assist with any medical intervention unless these forms are completed. Please contact the school as soon as possible to complete a form. This procedure complies with the policy regarding the health care needs of children at school. If there are any questions, please contact the school. Thanks.

NOTE: Forms have been sent home for students that we already had marked as having a medical condition (allergies, asthma, etc.). If you are new to the school or your child has a recently diagnosed medical condition, please inform your child's teacher and we will send forms home.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE: Kids Plus[™] Accident Insurance reimburses for accident-related medical and dental expenses not covered by provincial, extended health or dental plans. If interested please visit web site at www.iapkidsplus.com. Forms are available in the office as well.

Westcoast Recess: We strive to have 'West Coast' Recess/lunches (students outside on rainy days); therefore sending your child with boots, rain-gear, hats, gloves, is necessary and appreciated. Please ensure your child has a pair of dry indoor shoes and an extra change of clothes –just in case your child falls down and gets wet. By sending an extra change of clothes, this alleviates office pile up at the phone to call home and wasted learning time. Thanks for your assistance.

Bring your Water Bottle: Students are reminded to bring their water bottles every day. Some Primary classes have alternate arrangements with individual cups. However, it is solely at the discretion of the teacher. In past years the office had given out small disposable cups to students who had forgotten their cup for the day. This is now no longer the practice since the same students were leaving class to get cups every day. Thus, teachers are now the ones who determine whether or not they'll give out the small cups.

More Important News

INDOOR SHOES are mandatory. ALL students need to have a clean pair of shoes left at school so they can change into daily. These shoes should be either lace up or Velcro shoes as they will be wearing them to gym and playing active games. To keep our school clean and for your child's safety, indoors shoes are a must.

STUDENT EMERGENCY CONTACTS: We have sent Student Emergency Information sheets with *each* child. These forms were due back to class teachers by September 30th. If you have not done so, please return the forms. Thank you those parents/guardians who have returned the forms. These forms are kept in a file in the office to be used in emergency situations. Please read ALL INFORMATION and make any corrections on the sheet. Then, please return to your teacher. REMEMBER TO SIGN ON THE BACK!

BC SCHOOL and Fruity and Vegetable Program: We will once again be participating in this program. Students get an opportunity to eat fresh fruits and vegetables produced in BC and learn about BC agriculture. This program delivers food 13 times over the school year. These items are meant to be an addition to regular snacks. If you do not wish for your child to participate, please inform your child's teacher.

<u>DROP OFF/PICK UP</u>: Please remember that there is no formal supervision before the warning bell rings or after classes. Students should not be dropped off to school excessively early as there is no supervision at this time of day. To help us keep our students safe, we'd ask parents to spend some times reviewing the traffic and bus safety rules with your child. Please obey the traffic arrows at the school's entry. Parents, remember that we have a "Kiss and Go" practice so cars are not left unattended in the roundabout. When cars stop at random spots it does not allow for the maximum number of cars to drop off. **DO NOT PULL UP AND GET OUT AND LEAVE YOUR CAR.** If you need to leave your car, you need to park on the street. By all of us working together, it can make drop off less stressful for all.

Children riding bikes should wear a helmet at all times and are not permitted to ride on school grounds. Let's keep everyone safe!

STAFF PARKING/RESERVED PARKING: Since our school is growing, we have more staff, there are no longer spots available for parents in the parking lot during school hours. The parking lot is needed for our staff to park during their work hours. Please honour these spots by refraining from parking in the spots marked "Staff". Often staff need to leave during the school day (field trips), their spots remain 'Reserved'. Please do not park as teachers need to park and return quickly to their classroom to receive their students back into the classroom. Thanks for your assistance.



WHO IS AN ABORIGINAL STUDENT?

PHONING IN: Thank you for remembering to phone in when your child is going to be late or absent. As you know, an answering machine is available 24 hours a day for your convenience. For the safety of your children, we have a Phone Home Program. If we do not know the reason why your child is absent, we will contact all emergency numbers available until we can be sure that your child is safe. Please continue to phone or send us a message via the parent portal if your child is going to be absent or late for any reason. Thank you for helping us to keep your children safe!

<u>PLAY DATES:</u> There have been a number of children arranging last minutes play dates. Unless these are pre-arranged before school time, we cannot have children suddenly going home with other parents, especially since their own parents do not know of this arrangement. The office phone is only for emergency use, ie children not feeling well needing to phone home, not for arranging play dates. Thank you for your assistance.

HEAD LICE: Reminder, please check your child's/children's hair for head lice as it is head lice season. If you notice any of the following, please contact the office. This will be kept confidential and a standard letter will be sent out to the relevant classes informing parents of the presence of lice. Evidence of Head Lice may be as follows:

- nits found on the hair
- live or dead lice seen on the scalp
- nit shells from hatched lice or dead eggs found in the hair

<u>PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES:</u> Students are to leave cell phones, iPods or iPads in their backpacks, if they bring them to school. They are not to be brought outside during recess and lunch. In the classroom, devices can be used if the teacher gives permission. The school is not responsible for any lost or stolen items or any breakage that occurs on school property. Students are only allowed to use cell phones before school or after school to phone home. If students need to contact home, they need to ask the teacher for permission and use the school phone.

<u>VISITORS/VOLUNTEERS</u>: All visitors/volunteers must sign in at the front desk. We need to be able to account for all staff and visitors to our school/site.

Welcome back! A message from your local Police

Do you remember our Candy Cane or Pink Shirt school visits we did last year? The positive impact between police, students and teachers is a model we would like to build on in the 2017-18 school year. Often youth's only contact with the police is related to an incident or organized event and we want to change that by building healthy relationships throughout the whole school year by impromptu visits at the schools as part of our regular police business.





What this means is police would attend schools, check in with the administrators and spend some time at recess, lunch, or during assemblies or sports events to just be present as part of this school community.
