Message from the Principal:

Dear Parents and Guardians,

It's hard to believe September 2020 is over already and we're into the Thanksgiving/Hallowe'en/Fall season. It's been a month of many unknowns and even more questions but I'm pleased to report that things are now humming along nicely at school and we're all settling into our routines, albeit with lots of COVID adjustments. - We are hoping to still find a safe and appropriate way to celebrate Thanksgiving as our beloved (33 year history!) feast of soup, bannock, and pumpkin pie can't happen in the COVID world. Watch for details.
- We haven't heard about Hallowe'en options at school yet but expect that students will be able to dress up as usual on Friday, October 30.
 Our staff had a productive day on Monday, learning about and trauma informed classrooms and social emotional wellness. It can't be overstated, but these times we're all living though can be particularly challenging for some families in many different ways and we are hoping that at school, we support you and our kids and don't cause any extra stress in your lives.
