

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I have had so many interesting experiences with our kids this last month that I need to share some of them with you. Since starting to monitor 112th Avenue I have been so pleased to notice some students reading in their cars on their way to school. I have also been very impressed with the way our kids cross the street. They often make eye contact with drivers on each side of the road and then thank them for waiting. Thank you all for your cooperation in observing the school zone speed limit of 30 Km/h and avoiding parking in the roundabout.

Today I sat with a kindergarten student who read me three books with close to perfect accuracy and comprehension which is quite unusual for a 5-year-old. Recess and lunch have also seen some very cooperative and respectful behavior in the form of kids' inviting others to play, students trying out badminton, hula hooping, and skipping, some for the first time. Much like Remembrance Day, these activities will probably be limited to in class viewing.
