



Did your child have their routine vaccinations?

This year, students in grade 6 and 9 were offered routine vaccines at school immunization clinics. If your child missed receiving their vaccines, please book an appointment with their family practitioner, pharmacist, community vaccine provider or local public health unit. Routine vaccinations are free in B.C.

Not all family practitioners and pharmacies offer vaccines, so make sure to call ahead. For a list of pharmacies and community vaccine providers visit <u>fraserhealth.ca/getimmunized</u>.

To book an appointment at a public health unit call:

- 604-702-4906 (people who live in Mission, Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Agassiz and Hope)
- 604-476-7087 (people who live in all other areas of Fraser Health)

Make sure your child's immunization records are up-to-date

If your child was immunized at the school immunization clinic, we entered the vaccines into your child's electronic record and no action is required by you.

If your child received their routine immunizations outside of a school clinic, for example, their family practitioner or pharmacy, please submit your child's vaccine record online at: fraserhealth.ca/immunization form.

If your child received COVID-19 vaccine(s) outside of B.C., please submit your child's record to the Ministry of Health at: https://immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca/.

To check to see if your child's vaccines are up-to-date for:

- Routine vaccines use the online Vaccination Status Indicator Tool at https://immunizebc.ca/vaccination-status-indicator
- COVID-19 vaccines use the online provincial database (Health Gateway) at https://www.fraserhealth.ca/health-topics-a-to-z/coronavirus/covid-19-vaccine/immunization-record#.YICyLrbMl2w
