

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club serves the purpose of offering students a free meal to help them start their day off on the right foot. The model is eat and go, or grab and go. This means that students can grab a quick snack (granola bar, yogurt tube) to take with them, or they can stay to eat a quick meal (bowl of cereal, toast). Once they have grabbed their snack or finished eating, students are expected to head outside for some playtime until the bell rings for the beginning of the school day.

We do not have the space or capacity for students to be supervised by staff members until the bell rings.

Our staff are able to supervise students who are eating in the Breakfast Club area, but they cannot supervise students once they return outside. If parents are providing supervision for their child, they are welcome to come in while their student eats, and then head back outside with their child to wait for the bell.

Grade 8 Transfer Period Information 2025/26

For parents of Grade 7 students going into Grade 8

Online registration OPENS at **noon, Tuesday, February 11, 2025**. Deadline for completing a request for the Grade 8 Transfer Period is **11:59 pm, Tuesday, February 25, 2025**.

If you do not register by the online registration deadline, you will need to complete a request under the Enrolment Requests – New; Transfer; Withdraw (2025/2026) school year. See information under following tab, *Transfer requests (K-12), including late Grade 8 registration.*

Grade 8 students who did not register during the Feb 11 – 25 registration period will be able to register on the Parent Portal starting **noon**, **Wednesday**, **March 12**, **2025**, in the early enrolment period for the 2025/26 school year.

INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES: SNOW

As the weather cools, please review the school district's inclement weather procedures as they relate to snowfall and possible school closures.

The decision to close schools due to accumulating snowfall is ultimately the responsibility of the superintendent, who must balance the safety of students, staff and parents with the need to provide learning. The decision is not taken lightly and is the result of a carefully thought-out process that is reviewed after each experience and refined if necessary.

Except in rare circumstances, no announcement will be made if schools are open.

The decision to close schools is made by 6:30 a.m. Details are:
