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Parking Reminders

Parking at Yennadon is always a chore. Please remember that our parking lot is **closed to parents for parking during morning drop-off and after-school pick-up times**. Also, please do not park at the Annex parking lot or in the Black Sheep Pub lot as this space is reserved for their customers.



If you can, please try to park elsewhere and walk. The best parking places are the gravel area across from the gas station on 128th or down by Maple Ridge Park. If you choose to use the "drop off loop", please do <u>not</u> stop on the inside of the loop. Also, it is best to pull to the right and forward as far as you can when dropping off/picking up. Please <u>do not</u> let your child off in the street and ask them to walk between cars. Finally, any areas where there is a yellow curb, you must remain in your vehicle.

We do appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for some of you, but ask for your patience and understanding with this practice. We have found our parking lot to be much safer for the students as a result.

Dressing for the Fall Weather

We spend all of our recess and lunch time outside and with the cooler temperatures and rainy weather upon us, we ask that you ensure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather. If your child has a tendency to get wet and muddy during recess/lunch activities, we suggest that you send an extra set of clothing each day to avoid having to bring dry clothes to the school when such accidents occur. Also, as the rains seem to be increasing, please consider having your child wear boots to school and to bring a dry pair of inside shoes to change into.

Registration for **Kindergarten** and **c'usqunela Elementary** begins **January 2019**. Find out about the online registration process for both below:

c'usqunela Elementary – Registration for kindergarten to Grade 7 opens January 7 c'usqunela Elementary registration is open to students who will be in Kindergarten through to Grade 7 in September 2019 who want to register in this new school, located at 24093 – 104th Avenue, Maple Ridge. c'usqunela Elementary is scheduled to open for the 2019/20 school year.

Kindergarten Registration – Registrations begin January 21 Kindergarten registration for the 2019/20 school year is open to children who are **5 years old on or before December 31, 2019**. Registration Phases:

JAN 7-31: *c'usqunela Elementary Registration*: Open to students who will be in Kindergarten through to Grade 7 in September 2019 and want to register for this new school.

JAN 21-25: *Sibling Registration*. Open for siblings of students already attending the desired elementary school (currently in grades K-6).

FEB 1-4: *Choice Registration*. Open for all students who want to participate in any one of SD42's unique program offerings (e.g. Environmental School, French Immersion, Montessori).

FEB 12-19: General Registration. General registration for English school.

FEB 27-June 26: *Late Registration*. This phase is for parents who may have missed previous registration phases.

Grade 8 Registration for 2019-2020

1. All Grade 8 registration for the 2019-20 school year will be done <u>online through the Parent</u> <u>Portal</u>. **Registration will open mid-February 2019**.

2. The registration form will automatically populate with your child's secondary catchment school. This is determined by your address (not your elementary school). You can check the School District website http://www.sd42.ca for your catchment school. Please note that new development areas may not reflect accurate results of your catchment school. Please call and confirm with the school if necessary. If your catchment school is not your first choice, you will be given an opportunity to make other choices on the form.

3. <u>Out-of-catchment registrations may be restricted by the limits of the school facility size and staffing</u>. The district will accommodate **catchment registrations first** and then attempt to accommodate **sibling out of catchment registrations**; however, sibling placement cannot be guaranteed. Please refer to the acceptance criteria online.

4. All Grade 8 online registration must be completed by a specified date in March 2019.

5. Parents will be notified as soon as possible, usually after Spring Break, as to where their child is assigned.

6. Movement between schools (i.e. families changing their minds) after the February deadline requires a transfer process, as staffing for schools is established based upon registrations as of this date. Transfer forms for this are available at the secondary schools. Building space and available staffing limit this



process. Grade 7 students and their parents wishing to transfer schools are entitled to complete a transfer form through the process outlined above. For grade 7s only, a review of transfer requests will be completed before the Grade 7 orientation in May.

This year's Grade 7 all day event at secondary schools takes place on Wed., May 29, 2019.

CURRICULAR COMPETENCIES: Fostering deeper and more transferable learning

The **Curricular Competencies** are a combination of skills, strategies, processes and habits of mind that students develop over time. They reflect the "Do" in the Know-Do-Understand model of learning. Deeper learning is better achieved through "doing" than through passive listening or reading, and it immerses students in authentic tasks that connect learning to the real world.

Curricular Competencies are subject-specific, and they are linked to the curriculum-wide <u>Core</u> <u>Competencies</u>. A focus on the development of competencies actively engages students in their learning, and helps them to become critical and creative thinkers.



Divisions 13 and 14 are baking apple crisp. They are making a product through modelling of others and using materials, tools, and technologies in a safe manner.




Redesigned Curriculum: Know-Do-Understand
