School Assemblies

Student Absences and Late Arrivals

Please call the school (604-463-8871) to let us know if your child will be late or absent from school. Please leave a message on the answering machine if staff is not able to take your call. If your child is absent and we haven't received a call from you, our Office Staff will

make an effort to contact you to confirm that your child is safe. Students who arrive late for school (i.e. are not present in their homeroom classroom when the teacher takes attendance at 8:35 am and 12:35 pm) <u>must</u> report to the office to identify themselves and collect a Welcome Pass, which in turn must be presented to the homeroom teacher.

On rare occasions schools may be cancelled due to extreme weather conditions. Public announcements affecting closure of schools will be made by the Superintendent of Schools. For the purpose of announcing emergency closures prior to the opening of schools, the radio stations listed below will be contacted by the district office. Parent Portal SD42 Consent Forms Reminder

We remind all parents to sign-up for a parent portal account as this is our main form of communication and our main form of making payments to the school (online payments by Visa or MasterCard). It is the district's goal to become cashless and paperless. All newsletters are available to parents only via the Portal or our Website.

If you haven't already done so, please **complete all the consent forms** on the parent portal as soon as possible. These policies are legal documents and are therefore extremely important. These policies include such things as Student Use of Google Drive Services and Microsoft Office 365, as well as the Walking Field Trip Permission Form and Internet Use Permission. Failure to complete these forms may hinder your child's activity in the classroom. Please access each form in order to give permission or not provide permission for each child in your family at Yennadon Elementary. If you need assistance, please feel free to pop by the office anytime.

Head Lice

This is the time of year when head lice may show up in your child's hair. To prevent head lice among children at school, we ask that you remind your child not to share personal items such as combs and brushes. We also ask that you check your child's head weekly for the presence of head lice. We have some information about "head lice" on our school website and you can also contact the Public Health Nurse at 476-7000 with any questions you may have.







<u> Kindergarten Registration Process 2020 – 2021</u>

Registering your child for kindergarten is a big step, but it doesn't have to be a difficult one. With the easy new online registration process, you can register your child from the comfort of your own home.

Review the registration steps below to ensure you are ready for the big day. **Complete steps 1-4 before registration** to save time.

STEP 1: OPEN A PARENT PORTAL ACCOUNT

You <u>must</u> open an SD42 Parent Portal account to access registration. If possible, complete this step well before registration

STEP 2: FIND YOUR REGISTRATION DATE

Review the registration categories (**SIBLING**, **CHOICE**, **GENERAL**) to find your registration period. Dates are posted on the school district website. Registration for the 2020/21 school year will open January 8, 2020.

STEP 3: REVIEW THE REGISTRATION FORM

Review a copy of the online registration form before registration day. (Available starting January 2020 at http://parents.sd42.ca)

STEP 4: REVIEW ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

The order in which the district places new kindergarteners is determined by the *Acceptance Criteria*. Review these online.

STEP 5: REGISTER

Register your child at http://parents.sd42.ca

STEP 6: PROVIDE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Once you receive email notification of your child's tentative placement, you must bring supporting documents to that school.

Kindergarten Registration Categories

Sibling: January 8 – 14, 2020 Choice: January 22 – 27, 2020 General: February 5 – 12, 2020 Late: February 26 – June 21, 2020

All registration phases open at 12:00 noon <u>online</u>. Any child who turns 5 years old in 2020 (born in 2015) is eligible to register for the 2020/21 school year.





Grade 8 Registration for 2020 – 2021

1. All Grade 8 registration for the 2020-21 school year will be done <u>online through the Parent</u> <u>Portal</u>. **Registration will open at 12:00 noon February 4, 2020**.

The registration form will automatically populate with your child's secondary catchment school. This is determined by your address (not your elementary school). You can use the school locator tool at <u>http://www.sd42.ca/school-locator/</u> to check your secondary catchment school. Please note that new development areas may not reflect accurate results of your catchment school. Please call and confirm with the school if necessary. If the address you register on the portal does not match what is on file, proof of change of address will be required. Tenant Rental agreements are not accepted as proof of address.

2. <u>Out-of-catchment registrations may be restricted by the limits of the school facility size and staffing</u>. The district will accommodate **catchment registrations first** and then attempt to accommodate **sibling out of catchment registrations**; however, sibling placement cannot be guaranteed. Please refer to the acceptance criteria online.

- 3. All Grade 8 online registration must be **completed by 12:00 noon on February 19, 2020**.
- 4. Parents will be notified by email before Spring Break as to where their child is assigned.
- 5. Movement between schools (i.e. families changing their minds) after the February 19th deadline requires a transfer process, as staffing for schools is established based upon registrations as of this date. Transfer forms for this are available at the secondary schools. Building space and available



staffing limit this process. Grade 7 students and their parents wishing to transfer schools are entitled to complete a transfer form through the process outlined above. For grade 7s only, a review of transfer requests will be completed before the Grade 7 orientation in May.

There are no Grade 7 Information Nights prior to registration. Each school will host an information session for incoming students once registration is complete.

This year's Grade 7 all day event at secondary schools takes place on Wed., May 27, 2020.

Be Sure to Take Advantage of Education Savings Opportunities

Education Savings Week was from Nov. 18 to 22, 2019.

Almost 80% of job openings in British Columbia over the next decade will require some form of post-secondary education.

Families can open a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) and the Government of British Columbia will deposit \$1,200 into the RESP for their children. No additional money is needed to receive the \$1,200 B.C. Training and Education Savings Grant. Families can ask their local financial institution if they are one of the 56 official promoters of the grant and are urged to not be part of the 40% who leave this grant unclaimed.

The grant allows parents and families who may not be able to currently afford to put money aside to start a RESP. Studies indicate that children with RESPs are more likely to pursue higher education. Students can use the money to pay for their education expenses (e.g., books, tools, rent or transportation) in an apprenticeship program, a trade school, college or university.

Applications are open to eligible children between six and nine years old. Eligibility deadlines:

- Children born in 2010 have until the day before their ninth birthday to apply.
- Children born in 2011 have until their ninth birthday in 2020 to apply.
- Children born in 2012 have until their ninth birthday in 2021 to apply.
- Children born in 2013 have until their ninth birthday in 2022 to apply.
- Children born in 2014 can start applying on their sixth birthday.

The Government of Canada also offers eligible families with modest incomes up to \$2,000 for each child's RESP from the Canada Learning Bond. As well, the Canada Education Savings Grant matches RESP contributions up to a maximum of \$7,200 per child. More information can be found at: www.Canada.ca/education-savings



Core Competencies: What are they and why are they in the new curriculum?

The new curriculum centres around the following three core competency areas: communication, personal and social, thinking.
