<u>2020 – 2021 School Calendar</u>

Please refer to the last page of this newsletter for next year's school and district calendar. It summarizes all of the district and provincial non-instructional days, all school holidays, and our Student Led Conference days.

School Opening Day for Students

Tuesday, September 8th **at 8:30am** is the first day back for students going into Grades 1 through 7 for the 2020-2021 school year. On the first day back to school, students return to their previous classrooms. In classes where the existing teacher is no longer at our school, we will have another replacement. New students in Grades 1 to 7 need to report to the Library. Students come for



attendance, registration if necessary, and receive important information. **Dismissal is at 11:00am**. We need an accurate count for our enrollment, organization, and staffing. Please let us know if your child will not be present that day. For several reasons, we may not be able to organize students into "final" classes until Friday or even Monday. Many factors make it more challenging to fine tune class composition, and we may require

extra time. During our first week back, if needed, grade teams will do activities and assessments with students. This will allow us to welcome students back, generate some good school spirit, and make stronger decisions about class composition. **New Kindergarten students will receive a letter of instruction via the parent portal regarding their first day of school**.



Final Term Reporting

As we move to our final reporting term, you will notice some differences between our final term report and our previous (term 1 and term 2) reports. In our previous terms, students were involved in a "three way" conference with parents and teachers to celebrate their successes and establish goals for the next term. In this process, students showcased a portfolio of work, and engaged in conversations regarding their strengths and areas of improvement.

In our final term, there will be no formal conference. Instead, teachers will be sending home a one page final report. Teachers will report on Language Arts, Math, and other subject areas based on the BC Performance Standards. The BC Performance Standards describe and illustrate the levels of student performance in terms of prescribed learning outcomes using the following descriptors:

NOT YET WITHIN EXPECTATIONS

- the work does not meet grade-level expectations
- there is little evidence of progress toward the relevant prescribed learning outcomes
- the situation needs intervention

MINIMALLY MEETS EXPECTATIONS

- the work may be inconsistent, but meets grade-level expectations at a minimal level
- there is evidence of progress toward relevant prescribed learning outcomes
- the student requires support in some areas

FULLY MEETS EXPECTATIONS

- the work meets grade-level expectations
- · there is evidence that relevant prescribed learning outcomes have been accomplished

EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS

- the work exceeds grade-level expectations in significant ways
- the student may benefit from extra challenge

If you would like to further explore the Performance Standards in relation to your child's grade level, you can find them on the ministry website: https://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/perf_stands/
The final report is a requirement for each student's permanent record. However, it should not necessarily be the focus of your conversations with your child. All children develop and acquire skills at different rates and have different areas of strengths. Please remember that it is important to focus on the successes and the growth that your child has had over the entire school year. As always, if you would like to discuss your child's progress, please contact the classroom teacher.
