Drop Off and Pick Up Reminders in the Roundabout

Drop-off and pick-up at Yennadon is always a chore. Please remember that both the main building and Annex parking lots are closed to parents for parking during morning drop-off and after-school pick-up times, so we must work cooperatively in the roundabout. We need your cooperation to:

- Please reduce your speed entering and travelling through traffic circle
- Remember to pull up to the curb in order to drop students off
- Be sure to have students exit your vehicle from the right/curb side only
- Please do not stop in the middle of the roundabout/traffic circle to allow students to exit your vehicle, and run through traffic
- Please use crosswalks at all times; don't walk through traffic in the roundabout
- Be patient with all pedestrians and drivers

We do appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for some of you but ask for your patience and understanding with this practice. We have found our drop-off and pick-up to be much safer for the students as a result. Let's work together to keep everyone safe!

We think we have been doing quite well in terms of being sensitive to our students with severe nut allergies. We have asked that students not bring foods containing nut products, if possible, and teachers have been sensitive about not having students eat food with nut products in the classroom. Thanks for your cooperation as we continue to promote an awareness of our severe nut allergies. As we move into the Christmas season, it is especially important to be careful about the types of food that are sent for your child's snack and lunch. Please try not to send snacks or treats that contain nut products. This will help us provide a safe environment for all of our students. Dressing for the Fall Weather

Please ensure that you have completed the 2022/2023 SD42 Consent Forms on the portal. There are several important permission forms to complete, such as Appropriate Use and Use of Digital Tools (technology/internet), Personal Information Consent, Outside Media Release, School Photography, Yearbook Consent, and Walking Field Trip Permission. Please read through each form in order to give permission or not provide permission for each child in your family at Yennadon Elementary. The **Student Emergency Release Form was added later**, so please check that you have completed all the necessary information.

Middle Year Development Instrument – Grades 4 & 7

School District No. 42 has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings, and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 4 and 7 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between **January 10**th **and March 3**rd, **2023**.

New Provincial Proficiency Scale for Reporting

Learning is a dynamic journey, meaning that how and when students progress along this journey varies. The proficiency scale is a way for teachers, students and parents to understand a student's knowledge of the curriculum for a specific grade level and subject area. Concepts and competencies refer to what a student is expected to know and do.

Emerging: Students that are emerging are just beginning to develop their understanding and skills relevant to a particular subject area. Students often need direction and assistance to initiate and complete tasks that demonstrate their learning.


Developing: When students develop their skills and understanding, they practice and improve their ability to demonstrate their knowledge individually and consistently. This is a challenging time of growth and development that most students will experience as new concepts and skills are introduced.

Proficient: When students are proficient, they can communicate the expected competencies and content. These students can independently and consistently demonstrate their learning.

Extending: When students extend their knowledge, they can apply what they have learned to new and different situations. Creative, insightful, and strategic are descriptors for how these students demonstrate their learning.

The level of proficiency shown on your child's report card is only one indication of their growth and development. Their teacher's comments will provide more detailed information on achievement and the next steps for learning.

Kindergarten Registration Process 2023 – 2024

Registering your child for kindergarten is a big step, but it doesn't have to be a difficult one. With the easy new online registration process, you can register your child from the comfort of your own home.

Review the registration steps below to ensure you are ready for the big day. **Complete steps 1-4 before registration** to save time.

STEP 1: OPEN A PARENT PORTAL ACCOUNT

You <u>must</u> open an *SD42* Parent Portal account to access registration. If possible, complete this step well before registration.

STEP 2: FIND YOUR REGISTRATION DATE

Review the registration categories (**SIBLING**, **CHOICE**, **GENERAL**) to find your registration period. Dates are posted on the school district website. Registration for the 2023/24 school year will open January 4, 2023.

STEP 3: REVIEW THE REGISTRATION FORM

Review a copy of the online registration form before registration day. (Available starting January 2023 at <u>http://parents.sd42.ca</u>)

STEP 4: REVIEW ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

The order in which the district places new kindergarteners is determined by the *Acceptance Criteria*. Review these online.

STEP 5: REGISTER

Register your child at http://parents.sd42.ca

STEP 6: PROVIDE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Once you receive email notification of your child's tentative placement, you must upload supporting documents to the Parent Portal. Review *Supporting Documentation* online.

Kindergarten Registration Categories

Sibling: January 4 – 10, 2023 Environmental School: Jan. 11 – 13, 2023 Choice: January 18 – 23, 2023 General: February 1 – 7, 2023 Late: February 22 – July 28, 2023

All registration periods open at 12:00 noon online. Any child who turns 5 years old in 2023 (born in 2018) is eligible to register for the 2023/24 school year.
